A List of the Best Language-Learning Apps

One of the best ways to get in touch with new places and cultures is to study their native languages. Here is a list of the best virtual language-learning apps.

Babbel

Babbel focuses on teaching practical phrases and key words to improve everyday conversational skills. The users can have conversations with the app. In response, they will hear voices of native speakers rather than robotic voices. The one-month Babbel option costs \$12.95, but there are other deals in place for longer learning periods.

Busuu

Busuu not only allows you to practice a new language independently, but it also puts you in contact with native speakers. This interpersonal element makes Busuu an exciting option for those eager to converse like locals. Users can access Busuu online or download the app on their mobile devices for free, but they must pay \$11 per month for the Busuu Premium plan or \$13 per month for the Busuu Premium Plus plan to enjoy more features. There are discounts available for purchasing 12 or 24 months at a time.

HelloTalk

If you want to learn a new language and need some social communication, HelloTalk is an ideal choice. The program allows users to connect with each other and start chatting instantly. To help you learn a language like French, the app connects you with a native speaker. There are more than 100 languages represented on the app. HelloTalk is free for all users.

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Many people would be happy to go bungee jumping once in their life. But once wasn't enough for Linda Potgieter. The 50-year-old South African has broken the Guinness World Record for the most bungee jumps in one hour.

For Linda Potgieter, bungee jumping is a big confidence booster and a way of overcoming fear. Potgieter described her younger self as "quite fearful" due to coming from an abusive background and being raised in several different homes. "I decided that I had to do something on a regular basis that put fear in front of me," she explained.

On August 15, 2022, Potgieter jumped off the Bloukrans Bridge 23 times in just under an hour, breaking the previous record of 19 jumps. This was set by Veronica Dean—another South African—in 2003 at the same bridge. The bridge is South Africa's highest and is 216 meters above the Bloukrans River.

Potgieter said she got the idea to try breaking the record a few years ago, after reading about Dean online. Potgieter even contacted her on Facebook and the two of them spoke about Dean's record.

Already a keen bungee jumper, Potgieter started preparing for her world record attempt in 2020, doing lots of exercises with different trainers to get ready for it. She had hoped to break the record on her 50th birthday, May 10, 2022. However, she wasn't ready by then and did it three months later instead.

Each jump took about 2.5 minutes, Potgieter said. And although her body started getting tired around the 13th jump, she kept going.

"I've never seen anything quite like it," said Sofia Greenacre, a Guinness World Records judge, adding that Potgieter's record will be very difficult to beat.

You may have come across news headlines about coffee this week, like this one from the BBC: "Coffee pod (咖啡粉囊包) carbon footprint is better for planet than filtered (过滤) coffee."

The stories are about a short article published earlier this month. The article's lead author, Luciano Rodrigues Viana, a doctoral student at the University of Quebec at Chicoutimi, says earlier this month, he and his colleagues published their analysis comparing filtered coffee, French press coffee, instant coffee and coffee in single-use pods. They found that your plastic coffee pod may not be so bad for the climate because they may waste less water and coffee, and the machines may also use less electricity.

The article came as good news to lots of people who have single-use coffee makers, since they've heard for years that the disposable metal and plastic capsules in their machines harm the environment. However, the problem is, the positive attitude to coffee pods and the climate might not be true. That's in part because the article isn't a formal study that has been peer-reviewed.

Since the article was published, it has caught much media attention. Media scholars who study climate change aren't surprised by the comments on the article. When it comes to emissions, climate media scholars say the public should keep their eye on the ball. Climate media scholars worry that too much attention over individual actions like using coffee pods can distract us from climate solutions that can have a greater impact, says Jill Hopke, associate professor of journalism at DePaul University. Hopke says, "Paying too much attention to individual actions will make us lose the bigger picture of what kind of societal changes we need to make." Another climate scholar, Boykoff, says in the grand scheme of individual actions we can take on climate, reducing coffee intake isn't at the top of his list.

Makers of infant formula (配方奶) use misleading marketing and aggressive promotion strategies to drive sales. This is according to a three-paper series from the World Health Organization.

Manufacturers make unsubstantiated claims about their products, saying the products are very similar to actual breast milk and can ease infants' discomfort, state the WHO papers. They call for an industry crackdown. New products such as hypoallergenic or organic formulas or those derived from the milk of sheep and goats are sometimes marketed with the idea that they have special benefits. They are sold at high prices, the authors said.

The reports also criticize the industry for targeting health professionals, caregivers and families through social media. They promote formula as a positive choice. They also lobby (游说) against legislation to protect breastfeeding.

Concerns about the global industry go back to the late 1970s. That's when women were discouraged from breastfeeding their children. That problem remains in spite of public-health efforts to get more women to breastfeed.

"The formula milk industry uses poor science to suggest, with little supporting evidence, that their products are solutions to common infant health and developmental challenges," said Linda Richter. Richter is a developmental psychologist. She works at the University of the Witwatersrand in South Africa. The technique violates the WHO's 1981 International Code of Marketing of Breast-Milk Substitutes. The code advises against free samples. It also sets standards for labeling.

Nestle SA, Abbott, Reckitt Benckiser Group, Danone, China Feihe Ltd., and Dutch dairy cooperative Royal Friesland Campina are among the biggest makers of infant formula. None of the companies were directly accused of unethical marketing or lobbying by the international coalition of researchers. The reports reviewed 153 studies. They show how marketing practices have violated the WHO's code in nearly 100 countries since its 1981 adoption.

Consuming commercial formula has been normalized, the reports charged. Yet scientific evidence shows that breastfeeding provides superior energy and nutrients. It

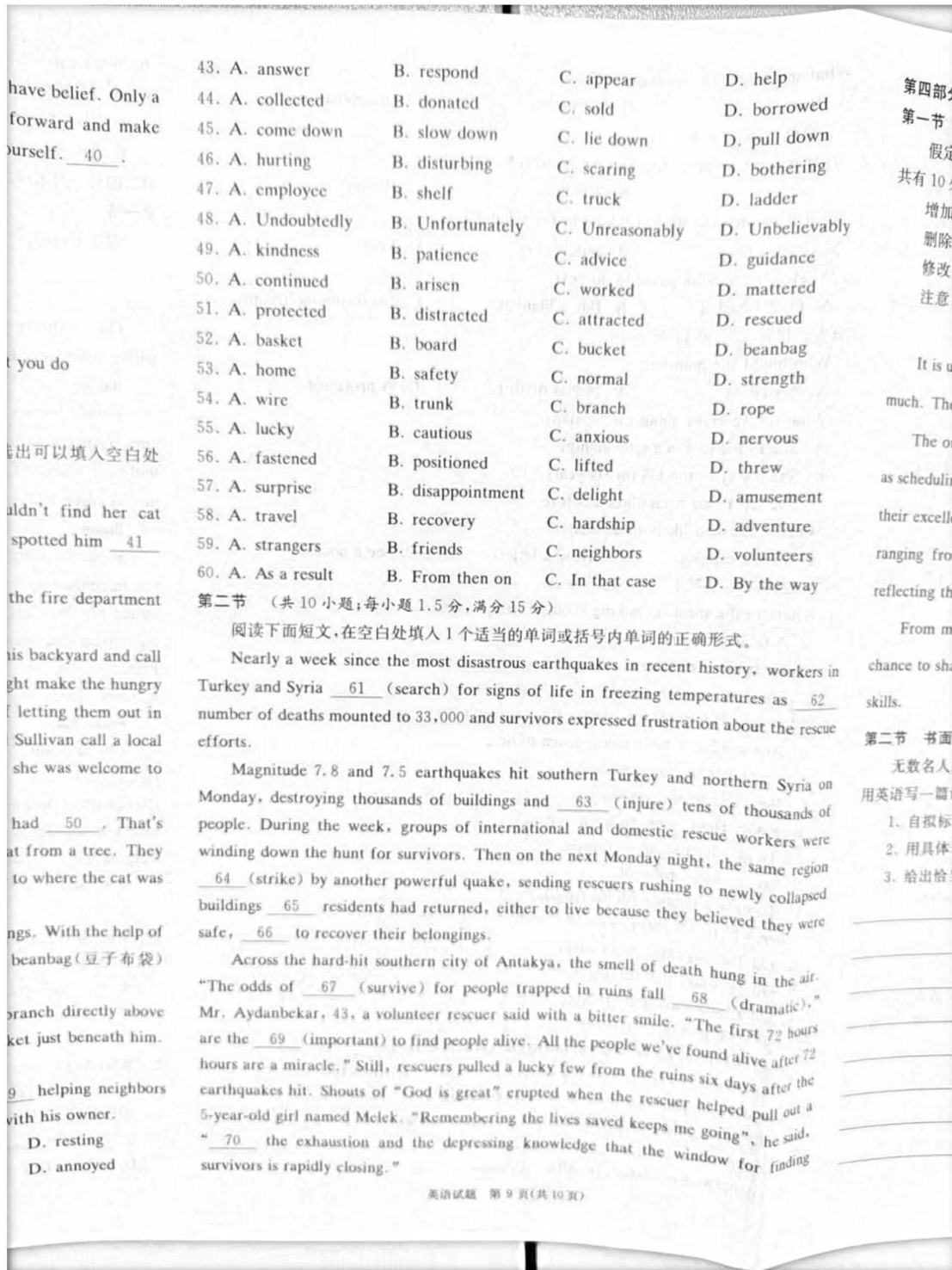

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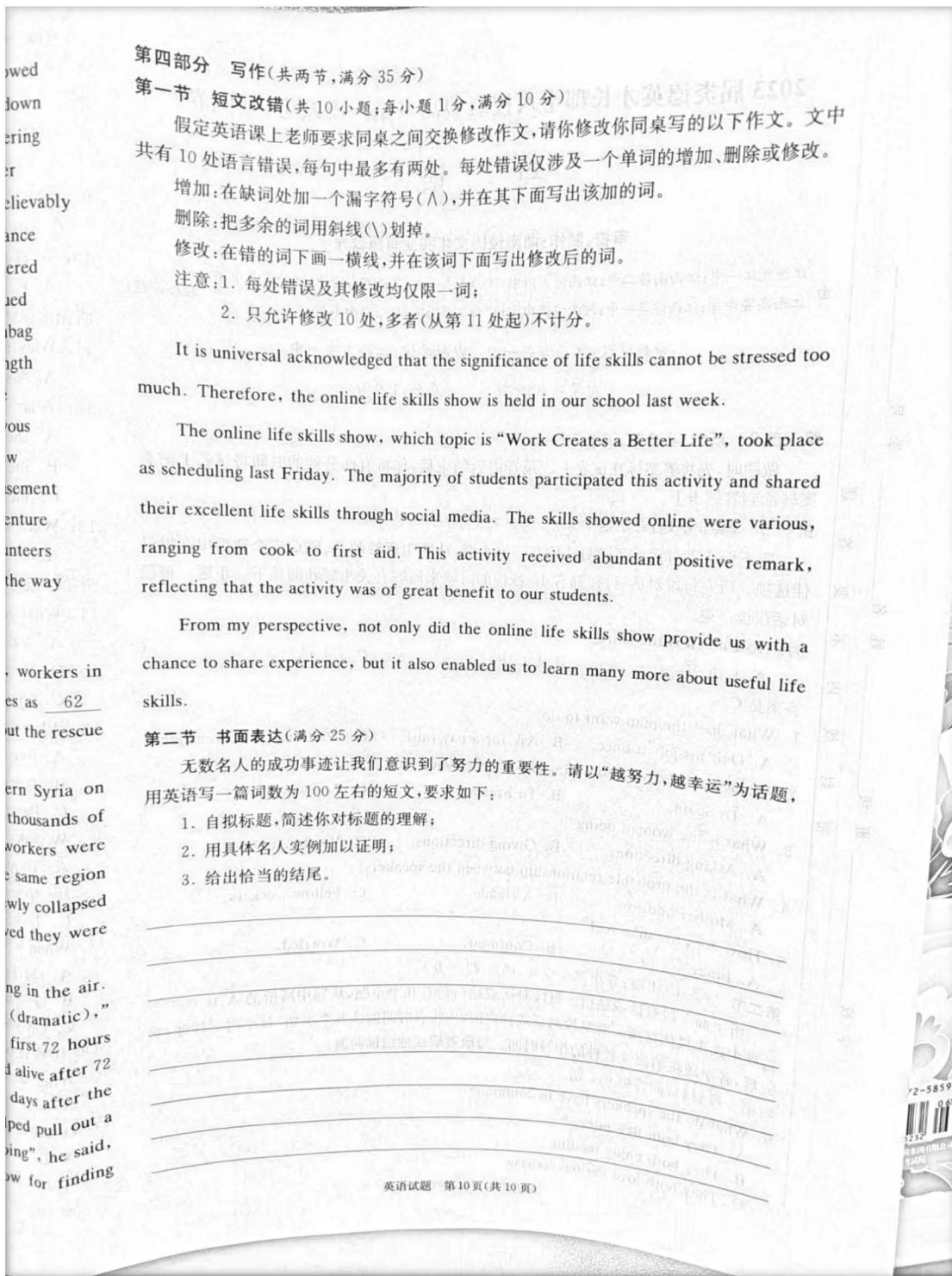
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
