第一节 应用文写作(满分15分)

 - 3. 词数少于 60 词或多于 100 词的,从总分中减去 2 分。
- 4. 评分时,应注意的主要内容为:时态、人称、内容要点,应用词汇和语法结构的丰富性、上下文的连贯性、语言的得体性及应用文体裁格式。
- 5. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面,评分时,应视其对交际的影响程度予以 考虑。英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。
 - 6. 如书写较差,以至影响交际,将分数降低一个档次。
- 二、各档次的给分范围及要求:

第五档(13-15分)

- 1. 完全完成了试题规定的任务。
- 2. 覆盖所有内容要点。
- 3. 应用了较多的语法结构和词汇。
- 4. 语法结构或词汇方面有些许错误, 但为尽力使用较复杂结构或较高级词汇所致。
- 5. 有效地使用了语句间的连接成分,使全文结构紧凑。
- 6. 完全达到了预期的写作目的。

第四档(10-12分)

- 1. 完全完成了试题规定的任务。
- 2. 虽漏掉 1、2 个次重点, 但覆盖所有主要内容。
- 3. 应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。
- 4. 语法结构或词汇方面应用基本准确,些许错误主要是因尝试较复杂的语法结构或词 汇所致。
 - 5. 应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文结构紧凑。
 - 6. 达到了预期的写作目的。

第三档(7-9分)

- 1. 基本完成了试题规定的任务。
- 2. 虽漏掉一些内容, 但覆盖所有主要内容。
- 3. 应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。
- 4. 有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误, 但不影响理解。
- 5. 应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文内容连贯。
- 6. 整体而言,基本达到了预期的写作目的。

第二档 (4-6分)

- 5. 较少使用语句间的连接成分,内容缺乏连贯性。
- 6. 信息未能清楚地传达给读者。

第一档 (1-3 分)

- 1. 未完成试题规定的任务。
- 2. 明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,原因可能是未理解试题要求。
- 3. 语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。
- 4. 较多语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响对写作内容的理解。
- 5. 缺乏语句间的连接成分, 内容不连贯。
- 6. 信息未能传达给读者。

不得分 (0分)

- 3. 评分时,应注意的主要内容为:与所给短文及段落开头语的衔接程度;内容的丰富性及创新性;应用语法结构和词汇的丰富性和准确性;上下文的连贯性。
- 4. 词数少于 130 词或多于 170 词的,从总分中减去 2 分。
- 5. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面,评分时,应视其对交际的影响程度予以 考虑。英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。
- 6. 如书写较差,以至影响交际,将分数降低一个档次。

二、各档次的给分范围和要求

第五档(21-25分)

- 1. 与所给短文融洽度高,与所提供的各段落开头语衔接合理。
- 2. 内容丰富。
- 3. 有效地使用了语句间的连接成分,使所续写短文结构紧凑。表达合理。

第四档(16-20分)

- 1. 与所给短文融洽度较高,与所提供的各段落开头语衔接较为合理。
- 2. 内容比较丰富。
- 3. 比较有效地使用了语句间的连接成分,使所续写短文结构紧凑。表达合理。

第三档(11-15分)

- 1. 与所给短文关系较为密切。与段落开头有一定程度的衔接。
- 2. 写出了若干有关内容。
- 3. 应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文内容连贯。表达基本合理。

第二档(6-10分)

- 1. 与所给短文有一定的关系,与段落开头有一定程度的衔接。
- 2. 写出了一些有关内容。
- 3. 较少使用语句间的连接成分,全文内容缺少连贯性。表达不够合理。

第一档(1-5分)

- 1. 与段落开头语衔接较差。
- 2. 写出内容太少。
- 3. 全文内容不连贯。表达不合理。
