In addition, the walls of the stations will be painted in gray, the main color of Beijing's traditional buildings, so as to be in harmony with the city culture of Beijing.

It is reported that there will be some advanced equipment in the four stations. Drinkable water will be supplied in the stations. Lifts for disabled people will also be included.
