#### B

The tables quickly turned for an 89-year-old pizza delivery driver who received a surprise delivery of his own from "regulars" on his route—a \$12,000 tip.

Derlin Newey delivered pizzas for Papa John's about 30 hours a week. He started the job after realizing he couldn't live only on social security checks. Despite being forced to work at his advanced age, he didn't let that affect his attitude. In addition to being a delivery driver, Newey was also a rising TikTok star thanks to some loyal customers inspired by his kindness. Fans of pizza, the Valdez family said they always requested him when ordering pizza and started recording his deliveries as TikTok videos. "It's crazy. Everybody loves him," said Dad Carlos Valdez. The family said his signature phrase with each delivery was, "Hello, are you looking for some pizza?"



With more than 53,000 followers, the Valdez family often got comments asking why Newey was delivering pizzas at his age. The family agreed that he shouldn't have to work so much and decided to use their platform for some good. They asked their followers to make a donation to help Newey, and the money started rolling in. They were quickly able to raise \$12,000. All that was left was to surprise Newey in his own home, making a special delivery to their special delivery man.

Newey was completely caught off guard. The "TikTok-famous" delivery man thought they were going to bring him a shirt with their signatures, which they did, but he got far more than he had expected when Valdez handed him a fat envelope filled with cash. "We collectively prepared a gift for you, and I'm here to deliver that gift to you on behalf of the TikTok community," Valdez said.

Newey didn't even know what TikTok was, asking, "Is that an online group where you communicate with each other through the telephone?" Tears welled up in his eyes as he gratefully accepted the amazing gift.

### C

Just as humans are usually left- or right-handed, many animals favor one side of their body for certain tasks. The strength of this preference varies: some individuals are happy to use either side, while others strongly favor one side (known as being strongly "lateralized").

The University of Exeter study found that grey squirrels which strongly favored a side did less well on a learning task. They had to learn to use a paw (爪子), rather than their mouth, to get nuts.

"It has been suggested that being strongly lateralized makes brains more efficient, with each hemisphere (半球) focusing on different tasks," said Dr Lisa Leaver. "This could help animals survive, which would explain the evolution of laterality (向侧性) across the animal kingdom."

"In fish and birds, there is evidence that being strongly lateralized is linked to better cognitive (认知的) performance (brain function). However, limited data from studies of mammals (哺乳动物) suggest a weak or even negative relationship. Our study measured speed of learning among grey squirrels and, in line with these previous mammal studies, suggests that strong lateralization is linked to poor cognitive performance," said Dr Leaver.

In the study, wild grey squirrels on the University of Exeter's Streatham Campus were presented with a transparent tube containing peanuts. Squirrels usually collect food with their mouth, but the tube was too narrow to allow this, so they had to learn to use a paw. By measuring both how quickly squirrels learned and how strongly

they favored a particular paw, the researchers could assess both learning and laterality.

More than 30 squirrels were observed, with 12 providing enough data for inclusion in the study.

The relationship between laterality and human cognitive performance is still unclear, though some research has suggested that less lateralized people may be more creative. "More research on mammals is needed to understand the complex relationship between laterality and cognitive performance," Dr Leaver said.

#### D

A Russian natural gas tanker has completed an experimental round trip along the Northern Sea Route (NSR)—the first time the path across the Arctic has been made at this time of year. It returned to the Russian gas station at Sabetia on February 19. The voyage by the Christophe de Margerie tanker through the ice is the latest visual indicator of climate change in the cold region.

The tanker set out from a Chinese port on January 27 after delivering its cargo. It entered the Northern Sea Route, which traverses (横越) Russia's north coast. A few days later near Cape Dezhnev, it was met by the Russian nuclear icebreaker 50 Let Pobedy (50 Years of Victory). Together they completed the 2,500-nautical-mile voyage through the ice in 11 days and 10 hours.

The ship managed to complete the first leg of the trip from Russia to China without an icebreaker. Both of the journeys broke records for winter navigation (航行) due to the changing climate in the Arctic allowing passage through thinner ice. Using the Northern Sea Route lets shippers in Russia and other countries avoid a much longer southern journey around Europe, the Middle East and all of southern Asia, saving millions of dollars.

The ships encountered no multi-year buildup of old ice on the route, and the deepest ice was about 5 feet thick. However, meteorologist and journalist Eric Holthaus called that a clear indicator of "a climate emergency".

Last May, Christophe de Margerie became the first large-capacity cargo ship to complete an eastbound transit of the Northern Sea Route, two months earlier in the year than the journey traditionally made.

"As a result of the early Northern Sea Route voyage completed by Christophe de Margerie in May 2020, as well as the current NSR voyage, the navigation in the Eastern part of the Arctic was practically doubled," Eric Holthaus said. He noted that for decades the transit route along that part of the NSR had typically remained closed by ice from November until July.

China's Zhurong Mars rover, dropped away from its orbiting Tianwen-1 mothership, touched down on the red planet early Saturday. China has become the third nation in human history to land safely on the surface of Mars—61 its first attempt.



Zhurong, named after the god of fire in Chinese mythology, landed on a broad plain known as Utopia Planitia Friday at 7:18 p. m.

Like NASA's Perseverance rover before it, Zhurong 62 (rely) on a heat shield (抗热涂层) and a protective aeroshell 63 (protect) it from the extreme temperatures generated after hitting the atmosphere at nearly three miles per second. Once through the plasma heating zone, a large parachute (降落伞) opened as planned, quickly 64 (slow) the craft to sub-sonic speeds.

65 (final), about seven minutes after hitting the atmosphere, the lander was programmed to fall free of its parachute, firing small rocket 66 (engine) for a powered descent (下降) to the surface.

The last 10 months have been for Martian 67 (explore). Three spacecraft, including Tianwen-1, were launched to Mars in July 2020. The United Arab Emirates' Hope orbiter, 68 will survey Mars' atmosphere from space, put 69 (it) into orbit in February. Not long after, NASA's now-famous rolling rover, Perseverance, and its history-making flying companion Ingenuity, reached 70 surface of Mars, landing in an ancient lakebed that may once have been home to Martian life.
