In1665, Johannes Vermeer, one of the greatest painters in Netherlands, put the last drop of paint onto a canvas and completed his masterpiece "Girl With a Pearl Earring." On an April day 357 years later, Janine Strong slowed her bike to stop, paused her fitness app, and watched unexpectedly as the snaking line of her cycling route drew the shape of Vermeer's masterpiece over the streets of Brookly

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Ms. Strong creates what has come to be known as "GPS art" — a practice that uses the Global Positioning System mapping capabilities of modern phone apps to create digital drawings with an athlete's route. It has grown with the widespressed availability of satallite tracking for use by ordinary people. In fact, the idea has been around since before the popularity of smartphones for fitness like Strava released in 2009.

In 2003, The New York Times Magazine told of how farenty Wood got the idea for GPS art. Mr. Wood said while he was using a GPS tracker on a flight and the plane flew in a holding pattern above Heath-row Airport, he was attracted by the pattern appearing on his Garmin GPS device. In recent years, technology has advanced enough to create visual maps in real time using a phone or smart watch.

"I get bored cycling on the same path in the same streets," Ms. Strong said. "Creating GPS art gives me more reasons to hit the pavement, which makes cycling a lot easier. I always have a hig smile on my face when it works out and I uploud it and it's done," she added. "It's a very satisfying feeling."

To complete her digital vision of "Girl With a Pearl Earring," she biked almost 50 miles around southern Brooklyn, carefully checking Strava to make sure each turn, circle, and straight time was achieving the shape of earring and head covering of Vermeer's original.

This summer we witnessed interview teams at the North Pole wearing short sleeve shirts due to the warm weather. A study published on Aug 29 revealed more concerning issues in the supposedly coldest area of the world. Zombie ice from a massive Greenland ice sheet was confirmed to be melting, which would eventually raise global sea levels by at least 10 inches (27 centimeters) on its own, reported Associated Press (AP).

Zombie ice is the kind of ice that is still attached to thicker areas of ice, but is no longer getting fed by larger glaciers. Since glaciers are getting less snow to complement the amount of ice melted, once the zombie ice is melted, it cannot be re-formed.

Scientists decided to look at the balance of the ice. In perfect equilibrium (** *** **), snow in the mountains of Greenland flows down and thickens the sides of glaciers, balancing out what's melting on the edges, according to AP. But in the last few decades, there is less refill and more melting, creating an imbalance.

Study co-author William Colgan told AP that 3.3 percent of Greenland's total ice volume will melt

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eventually. "Starving would be a good phrase for what's happening to the ice", Colgan added.

With a great number of natural resources buried under the earth, areas of melted ice revealed treasures that attracted the world's richest men. According to CNN, in early August, there was a "treasure hunt" in Greenland. Billionaires, including Bill Gates and others, financially backed KoBold Metals, a US-based mineral exploration company, to explore the rare metals under the glaciers in Greenland. The company told CNN that since there were enough minerals to power hundreds of millions of electric vehicles, the critical resource is capable of powering the green energy transition. While investors are taking advantage of global warming, experts feared that the mineral exploration is likely to worsen the local environment, draining up the world's resources at a faster rate.

Children who spend more time playing adventurously have lower symptoms of anxiety and depression, and were happier, according to a new research.

A study led by the University of Exeter asked parents how often their children engaged in play that was "thrilling and exciting", where they might experience some fear and uncertainty.

The study comes at a time when today's children have fewer opportunities for adventurous play out of sight of adults, such as climbing trees, riding bikes or jumping from high surfaces. The study sought to test theories that adventurous play offers learning opportunities that help build resilience (韧性) in children, thereby helping to prevent mental health problems.

The research team surveyed nearly 2,500 parents of children aged 5-11 years. Parents completed questions about their child's play, their general mental health and their mood. The research was carried out with two groups of parents: a group of 427 parents living in Northern Ireland and a nationally representative group of 1,919 parents living in Great Britain.

Researchers found that children who spend more time playing outside had fewer "internalizing problems" - characterized as anxiety and depression. The study in the Great Britain group also found that the effect was more pronounced in children from lower-income families than those growing up in higherincome households.

Helen Dodd, a professor of Child Psychology at the University of Exeter, who led the study, said, "We now urgently need to invest in and protect natural spaces, well-designed parks and adventure playgrounds, to support the mental health of our children."

Welcoming the findings, Jacqueline O'Loughlin, Chief Executive of PlayBoard NI, said, "It is clear

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from the research findings that playing, taking risks and experiencing excitement outdoors make positive contributions to children's mental health and emotional well-being. The rewards of allowing children to self-regulate and manage challenge in their play are widespread and far-reaching. Adventurous play helps children to build the resilience needed to cope with and manage stress in challenging circumstances."

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


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
