Sand sculpting is an art form which uses sand as its primary and only material to create pieces of art. Only fresh water or salt water may be used to give the sand its required hardness. This art form allows anyone, amateur and professional artists to create any shape by hand within a short time. No other structural supports and no pre-produced forms of any kind may be used either inside or on the sculpture.

In general, beach sand is not suitable for sand sculpting, because its grains have rounded due to tidal wash and wind, and it contains no clay. The sand used for sculpting must be guaranteed, free of toxins. It is processed and washed clean before use. Sand sculpting is only considered when it does not damage the quality of the sand in any circumstance. After use, the sand should be delivered back to nature as clean as it was before use. This makes the art form completely sustainable and friendly to the environment.

The building process of a sand sculpture was developed by Gerry Kirk in the 1970's. It consists of two stages, the compaction (压实) stage and the creative stage. First, the sand is put into wooden forms, mixed with water, and pressed into a hard mass. For sculptures measuring higher than 1.5 meters, heavy machinery is being used to speed up this process. This compaction process is the actual foundation of the sculpture. When this process is finalized up to the very top, the wooden forms are taken off one by one and the artists will start shaping the blocks of sand in its final form, from the top of the sculptures right down to the bottom. The wooden forms can be used to stand on while artists shape the sand.

The lifetime of a sand sculpture mainly depends on the quality of the sand, as well as the weather condition, location and climate. If built indoors under proper conditions, it can last for years.

Both Roberto and Keith have a 45-minute commute (通勤) time from their homes to their workplace. When Roberto drives, he has realistic expectations of how others drive and how long the trip should take. Overall, he is able to adapt to any unexpected challenges he may face on the road. He rarely becomes angry. By contrast, Keith drives with a tendency for becoming angry easily, partly due to unrealistic expectations of other drivers, his quickness to personalize and feel threatened by the actions of others, and his inability to calm his anger.

The difference between how Roberto and Keith experience their drive to work, especially with regard to getting angry, is influenced very much by their emotional intelligence. Emotional intelligence is crucial for helping individuals choose constructive over destructive anger. A key aspect of healthy anger is being able to pause and reflect on, rather than react to, our thoughts, feelings, and senses associated with getting angry.

Self-regulation and empathy (同理心) are two important components of emotional intelligence, which can be a buffer (缓冲) against destructive anger. Self-regulation helps us to control our moods. Empathy helps us to recognize the humanity in others and ourselves.

Studies suggest that training in emotional intelligence can powerfully impact how anger is managed. This was supported by a three-year study of 476 young adults who showed reduced tendency of becoming angry after training. Children and adults can learn skills to boost their emotional intelligence and, by doing so, develop adaptability for dealing with various negative affect, including anger. Many workbooks offer skills in emotional intelligence to promote empathy and self-awareness regarding emotions and how they impact our beliefs and behavior.
