4 Unmissable Washington D.C. Hiking Trails

Looking for the best hiking near Washington D.C.? You're in the right place! Here are four of the top trails in and around Washington D.C.

Rock Creek Park

As one of Washington D.C.'s biggest parks, you'll find almost unlimited activities to enjoy in Rock Creek Park, like cycling, swimming, rock climbing, horseback riding, and even boating. Thanks to its well-maintained paths and moderate height (300ft), the park is accessible to all skill levels. Along the way, don't miss the colonial houses, civil war fortifications and other old, historic landmarks!

Whiteoak Canyon Falls

Situated in the rolling hills of Virginia, just west of Washington D.C., Shenandoah National Park features heavily on our list thanks to its scenic overlooks, scenic forest trails and abundant waterfalls, the most famous of which is Whiteoak Canyon Falls, along the Whiteoak Canyon Trail. Many longer trails are well-maintained and therefore beginner-friendly.

Old Rag Mountain

Old Rag Mountain offers most wonderful views, but you're going to have to walk to get there! You'll be undertaking a 5—6 hour journey on beautiful woodland trails leading up the side of the mountain, not suitable for beginners. Along the way, you'll face rocky slopes(斜坡), narrow corridors, and a 2—3 mile-long demanding rock climbing.

Dark Hollow Falls

Don't let the name fool you. This is actually a fairly easy trail through a quiet forest. The only thing stopping you from reaching the 70ft waterfall is a steep and rocky slope. The paths are broad and well-maintained, but hiking boots are still recommended to help you keep your footing. The area is great for spotting local wildlife and birdwatching. Keep an eye out for many of the 190 bird species found in the park, such as the dark-eyed junco and the gray catbird.

The Pleasanton Partnerships in Education Foundation (PPIE) was started in 1987 to raise money for local schools. Based in Pleasanton, California, the nonprofit recently hosted a family-focused fitness event for the community.

"Our event helps to bring the community together," said Mindy Louie, events and outreach manager for PPIE. "We have more than 3,000 participants, hard-working volunteers, and cheerers."

This year's fitness event took place on April 30 at the Alameda County Fairgrounds. It featured races of two miles, five kilometers (about 3.1 miles), and 10 kilometers (about 6.2 miles). A new Kids Challenge consisting of a quarter-mile run was added to encourage younger children to participate. When asked to describe the run, 11-year-old Jeremy Louie said, "Fun, exciting, and enjoyable." Jeremy added that he was happy to help support his school.

The PPIE supports all 15 schools in the Pleasanton Unified School District, which includes more than 14,500 students and 800 teachers. To date, the PPIE has raised \$1 million for the school district.

A local runners' group called the BURN Youth Development (or B.Y.D.) participated in the fundraiser. The B.Y.D. began at the start of COVID-19 outbreak to encourage local kids to stay fit. Since then, it has grown to include more than 100 youth members, 30 of whom ran in April's PPIE event. "The B.Y.D. was born in the darkest days of COVID-19 to keep kids active," explained Jerry Wu, the group's founder and lead coach. "Watching them running happily makes me smile every time," he added.

Wu encourages teamwork and teaches the students valuable running techniques. Eighth grader Ollie Gu, a B.Y.D. member, was one of the top finishers in the 10 km run. He completed the race in 40 minutes and 46 seconds and won first place in the 12—15-year-old age group. "The race was extremely rewarding," Ollie said. "I'm looking forward to it next year."

Plant-based milks have been growing in popularity for years, but the nutritional content of different milks and milk alternatives varies.

The global dairy alternatives market is projected to grow from \$22.25 billion in 2021 to \$53.97 billion in 2028, according to a report by Fortune Business Insights. In February 2022, the world's first potato milk launched in the UK, which is described as being "deliciously creamy" and is advertised as "the most sustainable plant-based dairy alternative on the market."

While some people turn to dairy alternatives, the dairy milk industry is defending its product. It is reminding people that cow's milk is an excellent source of calcium(钙), protein, and vitamin D. It's also more hydrating(保湿) than water, according to a small study by St Andrews University in Scotland. However, some people shun dairy because of intolerance or environmental concerns, and for some, the concern is health.

Plant-based milks are not necessarily healthier than dairy, and when following a plant-based diet, dietitians recommend ensuring your dairy-free milk alternatives contain essential vitamins and minerals. "Choose milk alternatives that contain vitamins such as vitamin B12 and vitamin D, in addition to the mineral calcium," said dietitian Nichola Ludlam-Raine.

Nutritional content of milks varies, with some offering more fiber, fat, protein, sugar, and calories than others. For example, unsweetened almond(杏仁) milk is a low-calorie choice, but low-fat cow's milk offers the most protein. Cow's milk, for example, contains lots of calcium and vitamin D, as well as protein. Bean milk is often rich in calcium, and is also high in protein. Therefore, we consumers should always keep in mind the nutritional information when choosing which milk to have in our coffee, on our cereal(麦片), or alongside a cookie.

When it comes to education technology, it is clear that some technological advancements were not directly created for education but have made learning more accessible. Our planet is made of about 70% water, and 97% of that water is salty. All the oceans—from the Atlantic to the Pacific, from the Arctic to the Indian—are all salty! What is in ocean water, anyway? 36 But there are lots of other elements in the water, too. There are dissolved (溶解的) salts and minerals in ocean water. There are small amounts of many chemicals—even metals like gold!

Some of these elements enter the ocean through runoff, which is water that flows over the land and into streams, rivers and eventually into oceans. 37 And the acid eats away at rocks and soil. As a result, tiny bits of minerals and salts join with the rainwater as runoff and make their way to the ocean.

Salt also comes from the depths of the ocean. Deep down on the ocean floor, there are openings that push hot water into the ocean. The warm water from the openings contains a lot of dissolved minerals. These include more salt. A similar reaction happens when underwater volcanoes erupt. The seawater surrounding the volcano reacts with the hot rocks of the volcano. 38

39 You may have heard of the Great Salt Lake or the Dead Sea. These salty lakes are usually very large, and they form inland (not connected to the ocean). Believe it or not, some of these lakes can be ten times saltier than the ocean!

As droughts become more common and more severe, many hope that we could one day get more of our drinking water from the ocean. 40 However, it is not an easy process. Salt dissolves in water so easily that it is hard work to separate them.

"Well," I said to my husband, "we're now chicken people."

That's right. I ordered 15 chicks in the mail. I didn't do it just for the eggs. Instead, I thought they might help with our mental health. They give us a reason to go outside every morning and evening, often around sunrise and sunset, to feed them, give them water and make sure they're safe in the hen-house for the night. They've also helped

I had no good answer for him but instead just enjoyed the wonder at it. Then the next night, while we were making dinner, another hen named Marshmallow came to the kitchen window and just stared at us.

For me, the most impressive thing about chickens is their strange and mysterious sounds. When the chickens turned 5 months old, they started to make a sound like: buh, buh, buy, bah-gawk, with a strong emphasis on the gawk. The pattern repeats over and over for a few minutes straight. When I heard this sound I immediately stopped what I was doing and thought, "What on earth are they trying to tell me?"
