- 第五档：（21-25 分）
- 1.表达出所有内容要点，表述充分，完全达到了预期的写作目的。
  - 2.很好的语言能力，意义表达准确流畅，词汇丰富，句法多样，语言地道。有个别小的语言错误，但不影响意义表达。
  - 3.语篇结构完整,有效地使用了衔接手段，全文连贯。
- 第四档：（16-20 分）
- 1.漏掉个别次要要点，但表述出主要的内容要点，表述较为完整充分，基本达到了预期的写作目的。

- 2.较好的语言能力，意义表达基本流畅。用词和句法有一定的变化，有少数语言错误，但不影响主要意义的表达。
  - 3.语篇结构基本完整,能较好地运用衔接手段，全文连贯。
- 第三档：（11-15 分）
- 1.漏掉一个重要要点,但表述基本清楚,基本达到了预期的写作目的。
  - 2.语言能力一般，句法结构单一，词汇使用有限，语言错误较多,在一定程度上影响了意义表达，但要点的关键意义能表达出来。
  - 3.语篇不够连贯，意义衔接有明显问题。
- 第二档：（6-10 分）
- 1.漏掉多个重要要点,仅部分表达出内容要点,表述不清楚不充分,未达到预期的基本目的。
  - 2.语言能力较差，语言错误较多，严重影响了意义表达,仅少数句子能基本表达意义。
  - 3.语篇结构混乱,意义衔接有比较严重的问题。
- 第一档：（1-5 分）
- 虽然努力完成写作任务,但语言能力极差，基本无完整句子，仅有一些单词与试题要求的内容相关。

W: If the weather is fine, I'll climb mountains or have a picnic with my friends. How about you?

M: I'm going to visit my grandparents with my aunt.

W: I haven't seen you at the supermarket for a while, Bill.

M: I left last month. I finished my mechanics course. I'm working at the car repair shop next to the Italian restaurant. You can bring your car here next time you have a problem.

W: Now, if there are no more questions, let's move on to the next chapter.

M: Excuse me, professor—could we go over that last point once more?

(Text 4)

M: Is everything to your satisfaction, ma'am?

W: Yes, all the food is delicious except that there is too much salt in the soup. And your service is also very good.

W: Hello, Mike. This is Amber. I hear that you're looking for an apartment, and my brother Jack just rented a two-bedroom downtown. He is looking for a suitable roommate.

M: Great. I'm looking for a place right in that area. That sounds ideal.

M: Hi, Marina. Can I ask a few questions?

W: Yes, sure, go ahead.

M: As a photographer, you are quite successful. Can you tell me who can become a photographer?

W: Anyone can become a photographer, as long as you want it. It’s not like you need a degree or certificate or anything. Yes, I’ve been planning to take photography classes in an art school in the UK, but before this, I’d already been working as a photographer for years — I started by using my phone in junior high. Some of my photographer friends do other jobs at the same time — they are music makers, vloggers and directors.

M: What does a photographer usually do?

W: There are different kinds of photographers and our lives and work can be quite different, too. A National Geographic kind of photographer may travel to different places, taking photos of architecture, landscapes and animals. But fashion photographers like me, mainly do two things — commercial shoots and our own creative projects. The former is for making money and offering service to customers. The latter is for expression — we post these photos on our own social media, submit them to media outlets and contests, or host photographic exhibitions to show them off.

M: What makes a good photographer?

W: For commercial shooting, there are some routines that we can follow and the most important thing is to meet the needs of our customers. For our own shoots, what matters most is that you have something that you want to express, and these things can be received or understood by a certain group of people who think similarly.

(Text 10)

W: Mozart was an outstanding musician and composer whose fame continues to grow more than two centuries after his death. He was born in Salzburg, Austria, in 1756. Before the age of four, he had shown great musical talent. His father then decided to let him start taking instrumental lessons. The boy’s reputation as a musical talent grew fast. At five, he was composing music. From that time on, Mozart was performing in concerts and writing music. By his early teens, he had mastered the piano and violin, and was writing symphonies and operas. His first major opera was performed in Milan in 1770, when he was only fourteen. At fifteen, Mozart became the conductor for an orchestra in Salzburg. In 1781, he left for Vienna, where he was in great demand as both a performer and a composition teacher. His first opera was a success. But life was not easy because he was a poor businessman, and his finances were always in a bad state. His music from the next decade was not very popular, and he eventually fell back on his teaching jobs for a living. In 1788 he stopped performing in public, preferring only to compose. He died in 1791 at the age of thirty-five. Although he lived only a short life, he composed over 600 works.
