Text 1

W: John, come in here! The pot is boiling! What do you want me to do? Should I take it off?

M: No, just turn down the heat and cover it for another 10 minutes. (1) I'm busy doing the hamburgers. Do you think you can handle that?

Text 2

W: You have been getting poor marks recently. I think your mother and father need to be told.

M: Please don't do that, Miss. They were so angry with my sister because of her scores. I don't want to upset them again and I promise I will study harder. (2)

Text 3

W: Are you going to finish your cabbage? I'll exchange with you for my rice.

M: I'll do that. I don't like cabbage that much. Why do you want it? It tastes terrible.

W: I already ate a lot of rice, (3) and cabbage is healthy.

Text 4

M: I won't buy batteries like these any more. I'm not waiting four hours for them to charge.

W: You must have an old charger. Mine can charge big batteries in half that time, and small ones in a quarter of that time. (4)

Text 5

M: Let's go camping for our next holiday. We could buy a nice big tent.

W: No way. You will not get me in a tent, and I don't like treehouses, either. Maybe a motor home.

M: Fair enough. Let's hire one of those. (5)

Text 6

W: I put my phone down somewhere here in my house, but I don't know where it is now. (6)

M: Do you have that app which allows you to locate it by satellite?

W: Well, yes. But I thought I might do some ordinary searching before I do that.

M: Here's an idea. Why don't we just call your number? And then we'll be able to hear where your phone is. (7)

W: Of course. (7) The trouble is that I don't know my number. It's new and it won't be on your phone. I could ring my sister up. She has it. But how would I ring her?

M: Don't you have the paperwork the shop gave you for your new phone agreement?

W: Oh, yes. That's where I'll find my number. (7)

Text 7

W: I have been looking for a job for four months, but I can't find anyone to hire me. How did you get a job so quickly? (8) I remember you found one within a month. Do you have any advice?

M: Actually, it was longer than that. I began looking at the beginning of May, and I didn't get a job until early in July. (8)

W: Still, how did it happen so quickly? Did you apply for jobs online or ask your friends for help?

M: I advertised myself. I just mainly went into places and asked the managers if they were hiring. Many managers were surprised by this, but they also became interested because of my confidence. Most of them met with me immediately. (9)

W: I could never do that. Just thinking about it makes me nervous. They would definitely say no to meeting with me.

Text 8

M: Did you hear? The local shopkeeper is ill and has to close his shop. (10) How will he survive?

W: Oh, that poor man. He is old. His wife died and his children have married and moved away. (10) Who will help him?

the weekends.

W: Yes, and that way we will be able to care for the shopkeeper and make sure he is OK. When he recovers, he will be able to run the shop again. I will cook him a meal each day.

M: And I will make sure all his bills are paid. **Our children can do his shopping. (12)**

W: He is such a nice man. Everyone around here loves him. He has worked very hard all his life and he deserves to be cared for when he is ill.

Text 9 (第 13 题为推断题)

W: I started to write a story, **but I couldn't decide on the right ending. (15)**

M: Maybe I can help you. Tell me about it.

W: Well, the story is about a man who got a large apartment and a lot of money from his uncle. **The young man was sent away when he was only 12 years old, and he has been studying abroad for eight years. (14)**

M: When he comes back, no one probably recognizes him.

W: That's right. **Marcus has a good heart, (14)** and he wants to find people who aren't greedy or selfish. So, he pretends he is just a normal person. He sets up tests for Laura, the woman he is supposed to marry, as well as the couple who took care of his uncle for many years.

M: **What are the choices for the ending? (15)**

W: **I don't know whether I should make Marcus find out that Laura is bad or good. (15)** If she is good, he will keep the property. If she is bad, he doesn't want the wealth and will never tell people who he really is. The apartment and money will then go to the uncle's caretakers. **(16)**

M: **I like stories with sad endings. I would take the second choice. (16)**

W: I thought so, too. But I think I'll go with the other ending. I want to be able to sell this in America.

Text 10 (第 20 题为总结题)

Good morning, Nashville! I'll get right into the updates for today. **As you can see on the map, the big storm has finally turned away from Atlanta. It has changed its course once again, and looks to be headed for Charlotte, rather than heading south towards New Orleans. (17)**
