The weather in Singapore is hot. There are only two seasons: wet and dry. As is known to all, each month that ends in "-ber" means the rainy season. And when it rains, it rains cats and dogs. However, Singapore is definitely one of the cleanest countries on earth.

Singapore's tradition of eating out in places called hawker (商贩) centers is now recognized by the United Nations for its cultural importance. A hawker is a person who sells food or goods and advertises by shouting to people walking by on the street. Open-air eating areas where hawkers sell their goods are very popular. The centers offer many different low-cost meals for local people and provide a pleasing social environment. The 2018 film *Crazy Rich Asians* showed Singapore stars enjoying meals at a famous night market. Some sellers even received Michelin stars, a famous restaurant rating system, for their cheap and tasty meals.

There is so much more to learn about the interesting cultures and traditions of Singapore. Studying the cultures of the country will make your visit much more enjoyable.

Streaming has become prevalent since 2005, thanks to YouTube, an American online video sharing platform. Nowadays nearly three quarters of American households subscribe to (订阅) at least one video streaming service. With almost 200 million subscribers worldwide and a billion hours of content viewed each week, Netflix is by far the biggest paid service. No. 2 is Amazon Prime Video. Many smaller streaming services show nothing but sports, classic movies or the like.

In the early days of streaming, the advantage was the lower cost, and it still is. The average streamer spends \$37 a month and subscribes to three streaming platforms, while the average cable user pays more than \$200 per month. However, streaming has become more expensive in recent years. In 2019, Netflix raised the price of its basic service by 12.5 percent, to \$8.99 a month. A quarter of its subscribers, who were against price increases, said they would cancel their subscriptions. Few did.

A major reason: streaming networks have become home to many of the most popular TV series, including recent Emmy winners. They offer full-length feature films as well. Last year, Netflix received more Oscar nominations (提名) than any other media company. In fact, streaming has changed the Oscar competition, at least for last year. Usually only films shown in theaters are considered, but because of the COVID-19, all movies released online in 2020 are qualified for the 2021 Academy Awards. That shift is especially good news for Disney, which is putting much hope for movie *Mulan* on its new streaming service, Disney+. But watching *Mulan* from your own home will cost \$29.99—on top of the service's monthly fee of \$6.99.

However, too much streaming has its disadvantages. There are those who binge-watch, a term Merriam-Webster added in 2017 with the meaning "to watch several parts of a TV series or programme, one after another". Alejandro Fragoso from New York holds the Guinness World Record: 94 straight hours.
