B

Leek Town Warriors was a girls' football team which used to get routinely defeated every time they turned out, until James Henry stepped in two years ago. He took the job when the previous coach quit and transformed the team's fortunes. With the help of his assistant Andy Austin, they started training hard in April 2020.

Some players had never kicked a football before joining the team, so training them took hours of hard work and patience. After a good few weeks, they got down to training and really started to take it in what the coach wanted. "I insist on doing the basic stuff well and letting the girls decide what they feel they need to work on," James said.

James' first season was ruined by the pandemic, which forced him and Andy to get creative with training. They organized team-building activities with the girls to help them bond on and off the field. James then spent the sessions they could hold focusing on the basics of football like passing and shooting, bringing the girls up to a good standard.

James watched the girls develop over the course of last year, and in September they played their first match of the new season. They won the game, and since then went on an unbeaten run of eight games. The team's star player, 15-year-old Chelsea, has also impressed the audience individually, becoming the top scorer in the league with incredible 30 goals.

James said, "All the effort that the girls, us coaches and parents have put in to get this point has been enormous. If I hadn't had the support of Andy helping me every week, this would have been an impossible task. So I'm incredibly grateful to have him on side. All we want is to bring more girls into the game and show that it's not all about having the best players; it's about hard work and giving everyone the chance to play."

Identical twins Kathy and Sophie arrived at college last year and determined to strike out on independent paths, so they had requested rooms in different dorms. While Kathy got along with her roommate, Sophie was miserable. She and her roommate silently warred over matters ranging from when the lights should be turned off to how the furniture should be arranged. Finally, they divided the room in two and gave up on oral communication. During this time, Sophie kept seeking comfort from Kathy. Before long, the two wanted to live together again. Sophie's roommate eventually agreed to move out.

Sophie's ability to solve her dilemma by rooming with her identical twin is unusual, but the conflict she faced is not. Most roommate conflicts spring from such small, annoying differences rather than from grand disagreements over abstract philosophical principles. One person likes quiet, while the other person spends two hours a day practicing the trumpet. One eats only organically produced vegetables and loves animals, while the other likes wearing fur and enjoys cutting up frogs in biology class.

When personalities don't mix, the excitement of being away at college can quickly fade away. Moreover, roommates can affect each other's psychological health. A recent study reports that depression in college roommates is often passed from one person to another.

Many schools have started conflict resolution programs to calm tensions that otherwise can build up like a volcano preparing to explode, ultimately resulting in physical violence. Some colleges have resorted to “roommate contracts” that all new students fill out and sign after attending a seminar on roommate relations. Students detail behavioral guidelines for their room, including acceptable hours for study and sleep, a policy for use of each other’s possessions. Some schools try to head off the feud before it begins by using computerized matching. Students are put together on the basis of their responses to housing form questions.

As the global population grows and shifts towards urban living, the land available in our cities is being under increasing pressure. In order to be sustainable, cities need to find ways to minimize their urban expansion. One option is to build upwards; another is to dig down.

In Montreal, constructed underground to relieve overcrowding in the city streets is RESO — one of the largest underground complexes in the world. It is a network connecting everything from shops and banks to flats and hotels. This shows how going underground can meet human needs whilst also bringing certain environmental benefits. Underground transport can reduce traffic jam above ground, thereby improving air quality. Furthermore, thanks to their relatively constant climate throughout the year, underground spaces consume less energy for heating and cooling.

When planning underground construction projects, developers must consider existing structures

on or near the site, such as the remains of historic buildings. Designers must also ensure that any underground space intended for human use has good air quality. One example is the forthcoming LDN Hotel, an underground hotel beneath the streets of London. Designers are using a wide range of plants to help keep the air inside clean, together with a state-of-the-art ventilation system (通风系统).

Light is another key consideration. In New York, plans for the world's first underground park demonstrate novel ways of bringing natural rays beneath the surface. By employing solar technology, light is to be reflected down through a series of pipes into the terminal below. This light would be sufficient for photosynthesis (光合作用) to occur and the park's plants to grow naturally.

Today's architects are developing innovative ways to make underground spaces functional and comfortable. The question remains whether they can provide sustainable and realistic options for the future. Besides practical considerations, there exists the challenge of building a positive perception of "going underground". Yet, the obvious challenges of constructing habitable underground spaces must be weighed against the urgent issue of housing the world's ballooning population. One day, it will feel as natural to live and work underground as it does to do so over 100 storeys high.

18 All you need is a smartphone or a computer for most community science projects. Check out *CitizenScience.gov* to learn more and find projects in the database. If you're interested in a broader topic but you're not sure exactly what you want to study, you can choose a broader topic like "astronomy and space" and see a range of available projects. 19 iNaturalist allows you to record your observations to share with fellow naturalists. Or eBird is a great way to turn your bird watching hobby into a service for scientists, too.

You can be a citizen scientist no matter where you live. People often see nature, especially if you live in a city, as something that is far away or hard to get to. In fact, studying nature can happen everywhere, even in the cracks of the sidewalk. You don't have to be out in the wilderness. 20

Tai Chi is often described as “meditation in motion” There is 37 (grow) evidence that this mind-body practice, which originated in China as a martial art, has value in treating or preventing many health problems.

37 Tai Chi is slow and gentle and doesn't leave you breathless, it deals with the key components of 38 (fit) — muscle strength, flexibility and balance. Tai Chi improves balance and, according to some studies, 39 (reduce) falls. Proprioception (本体感受) — the ability 40 (sense) the position of one's body in space — declines with age. Tai Chi helps train this sense and also 41 (dramatic) improves muscle strength and flexibility, which makes 42 easier to recover from a stumble (绊倒). Fear of falling can make you more likely to fall. Some studies have found that Tai Chi training helps relieve that fear.

Tai Chi is very safe, and no fancy equipment 43 (need), so it's easy to get started. Don't be frightened by the names. Names like Yang, Wu, and Cheng are given to different 44 (branch) of Tai Chi, in honor of people who designed the sets of movements called forms. In some forms, you learn a series of movements, while others more focus on breathing and meditation. Finding an approach 45 matches your interests and needs is the key.
