As a child, Fischer loved going to the beach and riding bikes along the coastline with his father, Karl Fischer. So when he lost his dad to pancreatic cancer, he turned to the healing power of the ocean.

At the start of this year, Fischer wrote his father's name on his surfboard and took it out to sea in Newport, Rhode Island. His father's name shone in the sun on what felt like a shared adventure. Inspired, Fischer made a video and posted it on social media the same day. "If you love the ocean, or you know someone who loves the ocean, or maybe you lost someone who just loved being outdoors..., you can comment on this video with their name and a bit of their story, and I'll put their name on my board here, just like I've done with my father's name," he said in the video. "And I'll take them out in the ocean for you."

Names poured in from thousands of strangers grieving (悲伤) the loss of loved ones. And with that, the One Last Wave Project was born, the aim of which was to exchange stories with a community of people going through the same pain. They were essentially healing together. About two months later, Fischer had received over 5,000 names and written most of them on two surfboards. The first two surfboards ran out of space—he's working on getting more. He wrote the names in neat letters on the surfboard and put a clear acrylic (丙烯酸) coat over them so they didn't wash off.

Though a lot of people have been struggling with grief in the pandemic, Fischer was amazed by the responses that have poured in. "If I am able to help one person or one person shares their name, that is enough for me," he said. "But I am blown away—by not just the number of people sharing, but the depth of stories and love that they are sharing." And he plans to take his project around the world and connect with even more people—through shared grief and the power of the ocean.

Every year from May to July, tens of thousands of Tibetan antelopes from regions in Qinghai, Tibet autonomous region, and Xinjiang autonomous region make their way to Hoh Xil nature reserve in Qinghai to give birth. The mothers and newborn Tibetan antelopes make the return trip around August.

This journey is rather tough. More than 90 percent of the female animals give birth every year, but only about 30 percent of the newborns survive. Many of them die on the return journey, unable to withstand the predators (捕食性动物) and disease. The government has adopted some high-tech methods to assist in the safe return of newborn antelopes and protect the species.

In 2013, with the help of the BeiDou Navigation Satellite System, researchers discovered and confirmed the largest Tibetan antelope "birth room" on the Qinghai-Tibet Plateau, and they mapped the migration routes of Tibetan antelopes. Since late 2018, a solar-powered drone has been used to monitor the migration herds. "The solar-powered drone has a long flying time with high-resolution cameras, which gives us a new understanding of many specific routes during the migration of Tibetan antelopes," said Wu Xiaomin, an expert from the Shaanxi Institute of Zoology. "For example, the nomads (牧民) put fences on the grassland to protect the grass, but sometimes these hinder the normal activity of the Tibetan antelopes."

To clear the way for the Tibetan antelopes, the government of the Tibet has taken action in recent years to give more protected space to wildlife. They relocate nomads from places at altitudes above 4,800 meters to other places in the region.

Known as "plateau elves", Tibetan antelopes have adapted to the unique and severe natural conditions of the Qinghai-Tibet Plateau. According to Wu, the Tibetan antelope is recognized as an important indicator species of the natural ecosystem.

The population of Tibetan antelopes has grown. "With a recorded low population of fewer than 20,000 in Qinghai, the number has now reached over 70,000," said former Qinghai governor Xin Changxing at an event to mark World Environment Day.

Shetara Sims of Missouri has never forgotten the kindness the Kansas City Police showed her after one of her daughters was murdered in 2012. She said the department supported her every 41 of the way, sending detectives to check on her family and acting like “doctors, fathers, and lifelines all in one.”

As a single mom, Shetara has been 42 hard by the novel coronavirus pandemic. She 43 her job and had about \$7 to her name when she spotted a single dollar bill in a parking lot one day. She used the dollar to buy a lottery ticket and was 44 when she won \$100!

“With her current 47 hardship, we urged her to keep the money,” Kansas City Police Department (KCPD) wrote on Facebook. “She refused, saying the officer's family needed it, and police needed to know they were 48.”

Shetara insisted they take the money, 49 the police “floored and incredibly humbled” by her selfless act.

They shared the 50 on social media, and the community's response was quick and decisive. Hundreds of people 51 the police to find Shetara so they could send her a donation of their own!

"Even when we found her again, she asked, 'Don't the officer and his family need it 52?' " KCPD said. They set up a GoFundMe and urged residents to 53, and they definitely delivered! They've already raised over \$100,000 for the 54 mom!

What a 55 act of kindness! It's so important to appreciate and honor the goodness we see in the world.
