## 英语试卷参考答案

听力: 1-5 ABCAB 6-10 BCCAA 11-15 CBCBA 16-20 BCAAB 阅读理解:

A篇 DAC

【导语】本文是一篇应用文。介绍了4种有助于培养孩子们思维和动手能力的玩具。

21. 细节理解题。根据第一段中“**But the most powerful thing is that the children will associate learning with fun.** (但最强大的是, 孩子们会把学习和乐趣联系起来)”可知, 科学教育玩具最大的优点是激发学习兴趣。故选D。

22. 细节理解题。根据第二段最后一句“You don't have to be a scientist, since there is an activity book with instructions for possible experiments. (你不必是科学家, 因为有一本活动手册, 上面有可能进行的实验的指导)”和第三段最后一句“**It also has a simple instruction booklet that you can work through with your kids.** (它还有一个简单的指导手册, 你可以和你的孩子一起学习)”可知, 这两种玩具都提供操作指南。故选A。

23. 细节理解题。根据第四段中“**With 60 challenges (beginner to expert), this award-winning game can be enjoyed by all the family.** (有60个挑战(初学者到专家), 这个游戏可以让所有家庭都享受)”可知, Gravity Run 适合不同水平的用户。故选C。

B篇 BACB

【导语】这是一篇说明文。文章主要说明了人们长时间节食后体重会增加是因为节食导致身体运作缓慢。身体想要保持体重, 缓慢的减肥方法比大幅减少卡路里更健康。为了达到减肥的速度, 你需要摄入多少卡路里取决于几个因素, 包括你的年龄、初始体重、活动水平和性别。

24. 细节理解题。根据第一段中“**In a restricted calorie environment, the body adapts to using fewer calories each day to function. This leads to a slowing in metabolism, which makes it even more difficult to lose weight and ultimately leads to gaining weight again.** (在限制卡路里的环境中, 身体适应每天使用更少的卡路里来运作。这会导致新陈代谢变慢, 从而达到平衡。更难减肥, 最终导致体重再次增加)”可知, 人们长时间节食后体重会增加是因为节食导致身体运作缓慢。故选B。

25. 词句猜测题。根据第二段中“**Because the body wants to preserve weight, a slow approach to losing extra pounds is healthier than sharply cutting calories.** (因为身体想要保持体重, 缓慢的减肥方法比大幅减少卡路里更健康)”以及划线词上文“**It's better to pace your weight loss by eating just enough calories to keep you**”和下文“**while still meeting most of your body's energy needs**”可知, 健康的减肥最好是通过摄入足够的卡路里来控制你的减肥速度, 以保持你的不足, 同时仍然满足你身体的大部分能量需求。故划线词意思是“不足”。故选A。

26. 细节理解题。根据第三段中“**Determining the number of calories you need to eat to meet that rate of weight loss will depend on several factors, including your age, starting weight, activity level and sex.** (为了达到减肥的速度, 你需要摄入多少卡路里取决于几个因素, 包括你的年龄、初始体重、活动水平和性别)”可知, 年龄、体重和性别决定了卡路里的损失。故选C。

27. 推理判断题。根据最后一段“**She notes, however, those guidelines are “not meant to substitute for**

professional nutritional advice or treatment. It's recommended individuals follow the advice of their dietitian's guidance regarding appropriate calorie intake, as many factors affect calorie needs. "She also notes that if one is looking to lose weight quickly, he has to work with and be supervised by a health care provider. (然而, 她指出, 这些指导方针“并不是要取代专业的营养建议或治疗。建议人们听从营养师的建议, 摄入适当的卡路里, 因为影响卡路里需求的因素很多。”她还指出, 如果一个人想快速减肥, 他必须与医疗保健提供者合作, 并在其监督下)”可推知, 最后一段表明专业建议很重要。故选B。

### C篇 ACDB

【导语】这是一篇新闻报道。短文介绍了人类第一次展示了改变小行星轨道的能力, DART为小行星撞击提供解决方案。

28. 细节理解题。根据第一段“An asteroid (小行星) is moving very fast toward Earth, threatening every human being on the planet. Humanity has one shot to save itself with brave, selfless heroes piloting a spacecraft into the universe to destroy the asteroid.”(一颗小行星正快速向地球移动, 威胁着地球上的每一个人。人类只有一次拯救自己的机会, 勇敢无私的英雄驾驶宇宙飞船进入宇宙, 摧毁小行星。)以及第二段“*But that's the movies.*”(但那是电影)可知, 第一段描写的是电影情节。故选A项。

29. 细节理解题。根据第三段“*For the first time, humanity has demonstrated the ability to change the orbit of an asteroid,*” said Ralph Semmel, director of the lab.”(实验室主任拉尔夫·塞梅尔说: “人类首次展示了改变小行星轨道的能力)可知, DART的任务是改变Dimorphos的轨道。故选C项。

30. 细节理解题。根据第三段“DART had spotted Dimorphos only an hour earlier, as a dot of light. Then, Dimorphos grew bigger and bigger, until its surface filled the screen. The engineers were on their feet, cheering. “Normally, losing signal from the spacecraft is very bad,” Semmel said. “But this time, it was the ideal outcome.””(DART仅在一小时前发现了Dimorphos, 就像一个光点。然后, Dimorphos 变得越来越大, 直到它的表面填满了屏幕。工程师们站起来欢呼。”塞梅尔说: “通常情况下, 失去航天器的信号是非常糟糕的。但这一次, 这是一个理想的结果”)可知, 工程师们欢呼是因为DART成功完成了任务。故选D项。

31. 推理判断题。根据最后一段“*If any of those asteroids turns out to be on a collision course with Earth, the DART mission shows that changing its orbit is a realistic possibility.*”(如果这些小行星中的任何一颗与地球发生碰撞, DART任务表明改变其轨道是一种现实的可能性。)可知, DART任务的意义是为小行星撞击提供解决方案。故选B项。

### D篇 ADDC

【导语】这是一篇夹叙夹议文。本文讲述了有些人呼吁动物应该得到性别代词, 并介绍了其他人对这一呼吁的看法。

32. 推理判断题。根据第二段关键句The signers of this letter hope that when we write about animals in zoos, shelters, fields, farms, forests, seas and labs, they are recognized as living beings who feel hunger, fear, happiness and pain. “This update would reflect the fact that animals are sentient (有感情的) beings, and encourage people to respect and protect them and their rights and interests, and to shape a fairer world,” says Jane.”(这封信的签名者希望, 当我们写动物园、庇护所、田野、农场、森林、海洋和实验室中的动物时, 他们被认为是能感受饥饿、恐惧、快乐和痛苦的生物。简说: “这一更新将反映出动物是有感情的生物这一事实, 并鼓励人

们尊重和保护他们及其权益，塑造一个更公平的世界。”)可知，信件鼓励人们尊重和保护动物及其权益，正确使用性别代词来称呼动物，由此可知，第2段提到的信件的目的是改善动物福利。故选A项。

33. 细节理解题。根据第二段可知，签名者认为动物应该被称呼为“他”或“她”，而不是“它”，因为动物是有感情的生物。故选D项。

34. 推理判断题。根据最后一段关键句“Laura Hillenbrand, author of *Seabiscuit and other best-selling books*, tells us that if we don't refer to animals in personal terms, we open ourselves to abusing, ignoring, and exploiting (剥削) creatures whose capacity for suffering is no less than our own.”(《奔腾年代》和其他畅销书的作者劳拉·希伦布兰德告诉我们，如果我们不从个人角度来谈论动物，我们就会对那些承受痛苦的能力不亚于我们自己的动物进行虐待、忽视和剥削。)可知，劳拉认为我们应该正确使用性别代词来称呼动物，如果不这样做，就意味着我们没有平等地看待动物，可能会对动物进行虐待、忽视和剥削，由此可知，劳拉对A Stylebook的提案的态度是赞许的。故选D项。

35. 主旨大意题。通读全文，结合第二段关键句“A group of more than 80 people, including Dr. Jane Goodall, have signed a letter calling on the editors of the Associated Press Stylebook to change their guidance so that animals in news stories would be identified as “she/her/hers and he/him/his when their sex is known, regardless of species, and they, or he / she, or his / hers when their sex is unknown.””(包括简·古德博士在内的80多人签署了一封信，呼吁《美联社写作风格书》的编辑们改变他们的指导方针，以便新闻报道中的动物在性别已知时被识别为“她/她/她的和他/他/他的”，不考虑物种，而在性别未知时，识别为他们或他/她或他/她的。)可知，本文讲述了有些人呼吁动物应该得到性别代词，并介绍了其他人对这一呼吁的看法，“Do animals deserve gender pronouns?”意为“动物应该得到性别代词吗？”选项能够概括文章主要内容。故选C项。

七选五：EDGCB

【导语】本文是一篇说明文。文章主要介绍了如何使自己的新年计划付诸行动。

36. 根据空后“Lose ten pounds? Read a book a month? However, I've never given much thought to New Year's resolutions. (减掉十斤? 一个月读一本书? 但是，我从未考虑过新年计划)”中的resolutions可知，此处讲述的是年终做新年计划的话题，E选项“Perhaps most are also making new year resolutions (也许大多数人也在制定新年计划)”中的resolutions与空后的内容指代一致，且与“Lose ten pounds? Read a book a month?”内容吻合。故选E项。

37. 根据空后的“Then, I realize it would be better to set my intention to write and the time to write, say, from 8: 30 a. m. to 11: 30 a. m. (然后，我意识到最好将我的写作意图和写作时间设定为上午8: 30到上午11: 30)”可知，作者调整了计划的内容和方式。由此可推断，此空处表示上文的计划内容效果不佳，D选项“**But** the result proves far from satisfactory (但结果远非令人满意)”中的but为关键信息，且表达的内容为“结果并不令人满意”符合语境。故选D项。

38. 根据空前中的“The Premack principle is a behavioral strategy that states that the presence of a high-probability behavior can make a low-probability behavior more likely. (Premack 原则是一种行为策略，它指出高概率行为的存在可以使低概率行为更有可能发生)”可知，此处讲述的内容为Premack principle的介绍，其中的behavioral以及behavior与G选项“**In other words**, to enact a new behavior, attach it to a well-established behavior (换句话说，要制定新行为，请将其附加到已建立的行为上)”中的behavior所指性质相同，且根

据 in other words 可知，该选项是对空前内容的解释。故选G项。

39. 根据空格所处的位置可知，此处是对该段的总结，结合空前的The point is that it gets the action rolling without much thought or self-motivating talk.（关键是它让行动滚动起来，没有太多的思考或自我激励的谈话）”可知，让这种行动滚动起来不需要太多的思考，也就是成为一种习惯，C选项“Overtime, it becomes routine as well（随着时间的推移，它也变成了一种惯例）”可知，久而久之，这就成为一种惯例，与上文内容吻合。故选C项。

40. 根据空格所在的位置可知，此处应为本段的主题句，与上文中的小标题“Take advantage of the Premack Principle（利用普雷马克原理）”句式结构相同，应为祈使句，根据空后的“Let’ s face it, no matter how much you set an intention, if there's no enjoyment once you start, it will likely fall by the wayside. So, find a path you enjoy that will bring the same results.（让我们面对现实吧，无论你设定了多少意图，如果一旦你开始就没有享受，它很可能会被搁置一旁）”可知，一开始没有享受到快乐的计划，很可能就搁置到了一边，所以找到一条自己喜欢的路，得到的会是同样的结果，B选项“**One intention, multiple paths**”讲述的是一个意图，多条路，符合文章的主题。故选B项。

完型填空：CBDAB BCDDC ACBAD

【导语】这是一篇记叙文。文章主要描述了作者和叔叔在一个倾盆大雨，电闪雷鸣的天气，开车在路上行进的冒险旅程。

41. 考查副词词义辨析。句意：幸运的是，我们在车里，我的叔叔正在开车，他控制住了局面。A. Surprisingly 令人惊讶地；B. Interestingly 有趣地；C. Fortunately 幸运地；D. Excitedly 激动地。根据前文“**It was raining cats and dogs.**”可知，正在下倾盆大雨，我们能呆在车里是幸运的。故选C项。

42. 考查动词词义辨析。句意：幸运的是，我们在车里，我的叔叔正在开车，他控制住了局面。A. waiting 等；B. driving 开车；C. reflecting 反射，反映；D. cycling 骑行。根据后文“**So my uncle drove very carefully**”可知，叔叔正在开车。故选B项。

43. 考查名词词义辨析。句意：大雨使得可见度很低。A. ability 能力；B. reliability 可靠性；C. relativity 相对性；D. visibility 能见度。根据前文“**The heavy rain**”可知，雨很大，能见度很低。故选D项。

44. 考查动词短语辨析。句意：透过白色的雨帘，我能辨认出其他汽车上的小光点。A. make out 辨认出；B. set aside 留出；C. pick up 捡起；D. make up 组成。根据后文“**little spots of light on the other cars**”及前文“**He had all the lights on. So did the other drivers.**”可知，由于可见度差，司机们都打开了车灯，透过白色的雨帘，我可以辨认出这些光点。故选A项。

45. 考查动词词义辨析。句意：感觉它们随时就会落在我们头上。A. occur 发生；B. fall 降落；C. move 移动；D. rise 上升。根据前文“**Black clouds floated overhead**”可知乌云密布，感觉随时会落下来。故选B项。

46. 考查动词词义辨析。句意：闪电划过天空，射向远处的山丘。A. flew 飞翔；B. flashed 闪光，掠过；C. flowed 流动；D. turned 转变。根据前文“**Lightning**”可知，闪电划过天空。故选B项。

47. 考查名词词义辨析。句意：接下来的雷声不断发出低沉的声音。A. lightning 闪电；B. rain 雨；C. thunder 雷；D. water 水。根据“**made deep sounds**”可知，闪电之后伴随着雷鸣。故选C项。

48. 考查形容词词义辨析。句意：一些闪电离我们很近，随之而来的雷声震耳欲聋，即使我们把所有的车窗都关上了。A. disappearing 正在消失的；B. unforeseen 无法预料的；C. outgoing 外向的；D. resulting 因



而发生的。根据前文“Some flashes of lightning came uncomfortably close”并结合客观事实，我们先看到闪电，随之听到雷声。故选D项。

49. 考查副词词义辨析。句意：一些闪电离我们很近，随之而来的雷声震耳欲聋，即使我们把所有的车窗都关上了。A.out向外；B.in在里面；C.down在下面；D.up向上。根据前文“thunderclap was deafening, even with all our windows”可知，即使摇上了所有的车窗，雷声仍然很大。故选D项。

50. 考查形容词词义辨析。句意：突然，一声巨响使我们震惊。A. hurt受伤的；B. broken破碎的；C. shocked震惊的；D.depressed沮丧的。根据前文“Suddenly a loud crack”可知，突然的一声巨响吓了我们一跳。故选C项。

51. 考查形容词词义辨析。句意：然后我叔叔用颤抖的指头指了指车外面的东西。A. trembling 颤抖的；B.bleeding 流血的；C.frightening令人害怕的；D.slim纤细的。根据后文“Still trembling”可知，叔叔这时也很害怕，手指是发抖的。故选A项。

52. 考查名词词义辨析。句意：我看向那个方向，看到十米远的地方一棵油棕榈树从中间劈成了两半。A. place地点；B. space空间；C. direction 方向；D. way方式。根据前文“my uncle pointed a finger at something outside the car”可知，我朝叔叔指的方向看了看。故选C项。

53. 考查动词词义辨析。句意：我看向那个方向，看到十米远的地方一棵油棕榈树从中间劈成了两半。A.extended 延伸；B.split分开；C.sprang涌现；D.grew增长。根据后文“in half through the middle”及“it had just been struck by lightning”可知，树被闪电劈成了两半。故选B项。

54. 考查动词词义辨析。句意：它已经烧黑了，在冒烟。A. smoking冒烟；B. boiling沸腾；C. shining发光；D.cooling冷却。根据前文“It was burnt black”可知，树被烧焦了，正在冒烟。故选A项。

55. 考查名词词义辨析。句意：仍然颤抖着，叔叔很快开车离开了那个危险的地区。A. comfort安慰，舒适；B.unlucky坏运气；C.development发展；D.danger危险。根据前文“We were so lucky that the lightning had struck the tree instead of us”可知，我们险些被闪电击中，故该区域是危险的。故选D项。

56. 考查非谓语动词。句意：这种独特的文化由关于茶园管理、茶叶采摘、加工、饮用和分享的知识、技能和实践组成，是中国第43次入选该榜单，其总数超过了所有其他国家。句中已有谓语动词，所以用非谓语动词形式。be composed of“由.....组成”，在句中作定语，所以用过去分词。故填composed。

57. 考查时态。句意：千百年来吸引世界的茶，终于作为人类共同的文化瑰宝，得到了全球顶级的认可。此处考查谓语动词，根据时间状语 for thousands of years可知，谓语动词应用现在完成时，先行词 that指代名词The tea，在从句中作主语，从句中助动词应用has。故填 has appealed。

58. 考查名词。句意：千百年来吸引世界的茶，终于作为人类共同的文化瑰宝，得到了全球顶级的认可。形容词global后接名词形式。故填recognition。

59. 考查副词。句意：据联合国教科文组织介绍，在中国，传统的茶叶加工工艺与地理位置和自然环

64. 考查名词复数。句意：用茶来迎接客人，并通过与茶有关的活动建立良好关系的做法在多个民族之间共享，并为相关社区、团体和个人提供了一种认同感和连续性。名词individual为可数名词，根据并列名词communities和groups可知，用名词的复数形式。故填individuals。

65. 考查非谓语动词。句意：据报道，在中国，有40多所职业院校和80所大学设立了茶科学或茶文化专业，每年有3000多名毕业生专门从事茶叶生产和艺术。分析句子结构可知，这里为with的复合结构。介词with后宾语over 3,000 graduates与specialize之间为主动关系，所以用现在分词，作宾语补足语。故填specializing。
