The Cinque Terre, its colourful buildings, and grape- and olive-strewn cliffs were made a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997.

Santorini. Greece

Santorini is known for its white and blue architecture high above the sea. The island is an active volcano, though its last eruption was 3,600 years ago. Santorini's main town is called Firá and it sits on the edge of the volcano's crater, which is covered by the sea. You can walk from Firá to the next-door towns to admire the island's particularly beautiful sunsets from each of its cliffside towns.

Lima. Peru

The new world has cliffside cities too, including modern ones. Peru's Lima sits on the cliffs above the Pacific Ocean. While most of this city of almost 11 million stretches far from the cliffs, the Miraflores neighbourhood is a prime place for tourists to admire the views from the cliffs. Down below in the Pacific are surfers and soaring above the cliffs are colourful paragliders.

On May 24th 2021, Monday, two days after Yuan Longping, known as "father of hybrid rice", passed away at the age of 91, the farewell ceremony for him was held in Changsha city, capital of Central China's Hunan province.

People from all walks of life, including many Hong Kong residents and stars, mourned his passing away. One essential reason why people are mourning Yuan, both in the Chinese mainland and in Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, is that he helped this nation get rid of the threat of hunger. That's especially a matter of life and death to Hong Kong because it relies on import for over 95 percent of its food.

As a commercial city, Hong Kong produces little rice and almost imports all its rice and majority of vegetables and meat. The Chinese mainland is a main supplier of Hong Kong.

According to Tin Kung Pao, the mainland opened three freight trains that were used to carry agricultural products to Hong Kong in the 1960s, which operated until road transportation dominated the market in 2009. During the years, the trains transported over 100 million pigs and calves, about 1 billion poultry animals, and numerous vegetables, fruit, and rice to Hong Kong.

As a port city and international financial and trade center, Hong Kong could exploit every piece of land with potentials for commercial use as well as inhabit the large numbers of residents. It is the mainland's food supply that makes it possible for Hong Kong to sustain its prosperity with little agriculture.

The abundant supply of food in the mainland has much to do with Yuan's hybrid rice. Actually, the Hong Kong people, like their compatriots on the mainland, have never forgotten his contributions. When Lui Che Woo Prize was established in 2015, the first session of sustainable development prize was awarded to Yuan. And his speech delivered after accepting that prize in Hong Kong Polytechnic University was also a welcome.

Now Yuan has passed away, but his contributions will be remembered forever.

Although e-commerce has grown on the back of technological innovation, increasing smartphone usage and rising demand from consumers with bigger disposable (可支配的) incomes, it is far from posing any major threat to physical retail stores.

Indeed, growth of both the bricks-and-mortar(实体店) and e-commerce sectors are held up by a variety of systemic and structural issues that prevent the retail market from flourishing further. The first is fear of fraud(欺瞒) from African consumers. Online trade is not an area that most Africans consider to be trustworthy, and many consumers still believe that any demand for payment from an online source represents a trick.

This fear is worsened by a logistics network affected by problems—poor transport infrastructure and intermittent(间歇的) supply of electricity. To make matters worse, address records in many African nations are sub-standard, meaning that instances of undelivered packages, mislaid items or delays are frequent.

Even if e-commerce manages to solve these physical infrastructure troubles, and mobile operators manage to plough ever greater levels of capital expenditure to ensure that network coverage is strong, a potentially bigger problem remains. Levels of basic literacy in Africa are perhaps the lowest of any continent in the world. Around 153 million adults in Africa (around 38% of the population) are considered illiterate(不识字的). These structural issues are therefore likely to hold e-commerce back.

However, the irrefutable point is that access to technology is on the rise in continental Africa, bringing a larger range of goods to a wider range of consumers, and that signals a positive future for e-commerce companies that are prepared to play a long-term game in shaping a rapid-growing sector.

The variety of choices today, especially in entertainment and products, is almost beyond comprehension.

Going shopping? There's exponentially more to choose from at your local supermarket in almost every category. It's not just groceries, of course. Need a power saw? How about paint for your wall? So many options you could reasonably throw up your hands in despair.

Yet, I'm willing to bet if someone asked you whether you'd prefer more choices in life or fewer, you'd pick more. "Since, why not? More is better, right?"

However, here's what you lose when you have unlimited choices. First, peace of mind. It's stressful to have to go through an enormous menus of options, since it takes effort to sift (筛选) through the pros and cons of each, and what if you choose wrong? In an often cited study done at Wharton, customers in a gourmet grocery store were watched as they passed a display of either 6 or 24 types of jam. While more customers were drawn to the larger display, only 3 percent of shoppers who passed by bought jam at that table.

But beyond our confusion when we're faced with enormous choices, we have also lost a sense of community. Those three national TV networks back in the day aired shows that nearly everyone watched and that you could talk about with the confidence that they were well known by all. Today, you can't assume that any of your friends or coworkers are on the same page.

It's nice, of course, that there are so many choices. But the downside(负面) is that at a time when our society is crying for unity, some interest groups often cut off their fans from the rest of our society.

Obviously, we cannot change the present situation. Even as we feel overwhelmed by choice, we certainly wouldn't want someone else to decide which choices we should give up for the sake of peace of mind. But I do sometimes miss the days when decision-making wasn't always a detailed search among endless possibilities for that one, shining, perfect choice that we will never find.

I did not have a specific answer for her last question, but her moral support was important. With someone encouraging me and sponsoring my education, my spirits were greatly lifted up.
