Roger Rolls was the first black governor in the history of New York State, USA. He was born in one of New York's dishonorable slums (贫民窟). The children born here rarely did good work after they grew up. However, Roger Rolls was an exception, for he was not only admitted to the university, but also he became a governor.

At one of press conferences, a reporter asked him, "What made you become governor?" Faced with more than 300 journalists, Rolls did not mention his struggle but only spoke of his primary school schoolmaster — Pierre Paul.

In 1961, Pierre Paul was engaged as the director and principal of Nobita Primary School. When he entered this school, he found the children here did not cooperate with the teachers. Pierre Paul thought up many ways to guide them, but none was effective. Later, he found these children were very superstitious (迷信的), so when he gave lectures, he added a program of palm reading as a means of fortune-telling, with which he encouraged the students.

When Rolls jumped to the platform with his small hands stretched out, Pierre Paul said, "As soon as I see your slim little fingers, I know you will be governor of New York State in future." At that moment,

Rolls was shocked because only his grandmother inspired him once, saying that he could become captain of a five-ton ship. This time, Pierre Paul said he could become governor of New York State, so he remembered that remark and believed him.

From that day on, the "New York State Governor" was like a banner (旗帜) that constantly inspired him to study energetically and make progress. Rolls no longer stained his clothes with mud, nor did he speak in foul language. He began to straighten his back when he was walking. In the next more than 40 years, he demanded himself according to the identity of a governor. At the age of 51, he finally became governor of New York State.

Two things make Namibian diamonds among the world's most desirable, says Kennedy Hamutenya, CEO of Namib Desert Diamonds (NDD), the marketing and sales company that is creating a sustainable market for these unique stones.

"Firstly, almost 98 percent of them are gem (宝石) quality and, secondly, their naturally polished and round shapes make them easier to cut to highlight the high-quality brilliance that shines out of them". A further attraction is that Namibian diamonds are conflict free — the country is seen as a model of good governance within the industry. "Unfortunately, access to these precious gems was limited until NDD was set up in 2016," notes Hamutenya.

The government established the company to create a Namibian footprint in the international downstream diamond market and to help develop a sustainable national industry that adds value to the country's natural resources and promotes socioeconomic growth.

The strategy has worked. "In the past two years, we have made handsome profits for the government, and have paid tens of millions of dollars in taxes and interests for the benefit of all Namibian people," he states. Part of the reason for this accomplishment, Hamutenya believes, is NDD's highly skilled staff. In addition, the company uses the latest technology at its state-of-the-art headquarters, he says, "This enables us to take our understanding of our product to another level and to price our prized product competitively."

To add more value to Namibian diamonds, the company is considering entering the jewelry business soon, by strengthening partnerships with established brands as a way of quickly developing the Namibian brand.

"NDD is aiming to be the leading supplier of high-quality gem diamonds to consumers," explains Hamutenya, "We'll be a brand of choice for diamond lovers worldwide sooner rather than later — watch this space!"

A new social media trend called 'sadfishing', a practice of writing about one's emotional problems on social media in a vague way in an attempt to attract sympathetic responses, has been especially fuelled by celebrities, who are spoken ill of for posting exaggerated (夸张的) expressions about their emotional problems on their sites to draw clicks.

But while people are quick to criticise celebrities, a new study by Digital Awareness UK (DAUK) has found teenagers facing actual unhappiness and reasonably seeking support online are often accused of trying to be in the swim. This rejection can go on to damage teenagers' already fragile self-respect with some reporting that they have been badly treated as a consequence. And in extreme examples some are left exposed to sexual organizations online, which use comments that show a need for emotional support as a platform to connect with teenagers and gain their trust so as to take advantage of it at a later point.

"DAUK is concerned about the number of students who are bullied (欺凌) for sadfishing through comments on social media or messaging apps, thus worsening what could be a serious mental health problem. We have noticed that students are often left feeling disappointed by not getting the support they need online," the study says.

The study comes as it was shown in a US survey by HMC magazine last month that teenagers who used social media more heavily were more likely to report issues such as depression, anxiety and loneliness as well as aggression and anti-social behaviour, than teenagers who did not use social media.

The latest further research, however, published in the LCAH journal suggested while frequent use of social media does appear to be linked to having a negative effect on mental health, it is the side effects of social media use that could present more of a problem. It indicates that it could come down to young social media users going without other activities, such as sleep and exercise or that it opens the door to online bullying.

While popular diets may help with fast weight loss, staying thin is difficult. Their studies show that plant-based diets are good in the long term while eating less meat helps with weight loss.

"The way we think about food is important when it comes to diet," Hunnes said. How different cultures think about different kinds of food can influence people's food choice to eat and weight. Hunnes says the western diet is not healthy and can be a cause of cancers, heart disease and other health problems. Eating a lot of meat adds to the problem. 40
