Now that there are more than 7 billion people in the world, parents have never had so much pressure to choose a unique name.

Tanwen

Tanwen is a Welsh name typically assigned to girls. Sources identify the meaning of the name as either "white fire" or "holy fire". This name may be the most uncommon one that we've heard so far. There are no known famous people who have been given the name Tanwen. If you're looking for a baby name that virtually no one else has, this one may be the winner.

Venetia

Venetia is a female name that means Venice, Italy. Similar to the name Florence, its significance is coming from the land to which it refers. Strangely, most of the famous figures with the name were not Italian but English. In America, the name was known by the actress Venetia Stevenson in the 1950s, though it didn't quite catch on.

Jessamy

Jessamy is a Persian name that means jasmine(茉莉) flower. It is an ideal name for those who love the name Jasmine but are looking for something unique. The name is also the title of a children's story by Barbara Sleigh. Being that the story came out in 1967 and was named after its protagonist, it made sense that there was a spike(剧增) in the name's popularity in the 1970s.

Roone

Roone is an Irish name that means red-headed. The only Roone to appear in pop culture was the American sports and news broadcasting executive Roone Arledge. He was active from the late 1960s to the 1980s and he did have red hair, though it turned white towards the end of his career.

On October 23rd, race cars at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway moved around the track at high speeds—with no one driving them. The race was an international contest for the fastest self-driving car, with a \$1 million prize.

Many big companies are working to develop self-driving cars. These companies have huge teams of highly trained professionals. They've spent years developing and testing their cars, sensors and software. That wasn't true for the nine teams of college students that took part. Many teams were made up of students from different universities, different countries, and even different continents. Most teams only had their cars for a few months. To keep things fair, each team was given exactly the same kind of car.

Originally, the cars were meant to race together. That turned out to be too difficult. It was hard enough to go around the curves of the race track without spinning out. Instead, each car raced by itself, doing several laps(圈). After a few warm-up laps, the cars did two speed laps, as fast as they could go. The teams were judged on the average speed of those two speed laps. Only four teams made it past the first round, which also included an obstacle course.

In the final round, the car of one team, PoliMOVE, reached 253 kph on the straight

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section of the track as it was warming up, but later wound up hitting a wall. Another team, MIT-PITT-RW, also hit a wall. The EuroRacing team had a great first lap speed of 224 kph. But because of an error in their program, the car stopped early and didn't drive its second speed lap. TUM Autonomous Motorsport, a team from the Technical University of Munich, won the \$1 million grand prize with its two-lap average speed of 218.78 kph.

But all of the teams gained a huge amount of knowledge as a result of the competition. The race's organizer hopes that the progress made by the students will help improve onthe-road safety for all self-driving cars.

From one "spaceman" to another, William Shatner of Star Trek has recorded a video message for the six astronauts living 240 miles above Earth on the International Space Station.

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"I wish you really good luck, good health, get some good work done, and we look forward to your coming back," the actor known for playing Capt. James T. Kirk in the original *Star Trek* television series said in the video.

Shatner released an album of space-themed songs in late 2011 called *Seeking Major Tom*, which features new covers of classics from David Bowie, Queen, Pink Floyd and others. Shatner sings, along with guest artists such as Sheryl Crow, Lyle Lovett, Peter Frampton and others.

Apparently, the current space station crew of two NASA astronauts, three Russian cosmonauts, and a European astronaut from the Netherlands enjoy listening to Shatner's album in their home away from home.

"Did you know the crew of the International Space Station listened to my Seeking Major Tom album?" Shatner wrote on the Internet Sunday.

To express his enthusiasm about his new fans, Shatner recorded a greeting for the real-life spacemen. "Six months in space is a long time, and if you listen to my record, the time will pass by quickly," Shatner says in the message. "Not quickly enough, but you've got so much to do up there."

Commander Dan Burbank is leading the current station mission, called Expedition 30. The astronauts serve about five months in space before being relieved by replacements from among the five partner space agencies: NASA, the Russian Federal Space Agency, the Canadian Space Agency, the European Space Agency, and the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA).

Burbank and two of the other current crew, Anton Shkaplerov and Anatoly Ivanishin of Russia, are due to undock from the space station this week and fly back to Earth Friday aboard a Russian Soyuz space capsule.

A growing number of US companies are now offering homes built with three-dimensional, or 3D printing technology. The companies say 3D printers can build homes faster, with a lot less money, and in a much more environment-friendly way than traditional building methods. They say the technology may also help solve America's shortage of affordable housing.

3D printers make physical objects based on 3D models created by a computer. The machines put down many thin layers of material—such as plastic, metal or concrete—on top of each other. Objects are created through this process, from the bottom up.

In recent years, 3D printers have mostly been used to create small, specialized items. This includes parts for automobiles, airplanes and medical devices. Many consumer products can also be printed, from clothes to foods.

Now, an increasing number of start-up companies are using 3D printing to build entire homes. Since the technology is still developing, not many have yet been built. However, the top companies plan to greatly increase production in the coming years.

The start-up company Icon, based in Austin, Texas, made news in 2018 by completing the first permitted 3D printed home in the US. At the time, it said the home had been built in just a day.

Since then, the company says it has been developing new technologies in robotics, software and manufacturing materials. It has designed its own 3D printer and says the robot-powered machine can create structures up to 185 square meters. The printing process uses a cement-based mixture that Icon says is stronger and less costly than traditional building materials.

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To date, Icon has completed twenty-four 3D printed homes in the US and Mexico. Among them is a community of 3D printed homes in a poor neighborhood in Mexico. The company has also completed a series of structures for homeless people in Austin. And it says it plans to open America's first housing development of 3D printed homes this summer.

Losing your wallet is one of those events that unfortunately sometimes happen.

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


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
