【文章大意】本文是一篇应用文。本文介绍了关于健康的科学这门课程的相关内容。

- 21. B 细节理解题。根据文章的 What will you learn? 部分列出的几个条目可知,"Techniques used to improve your finances(用来提升你的经济状况的技术)"并不在你能学习到的内容里面。故选 B。
- 22. C 细节理解题。根据文章的 Who are your instructors? 这个部分"Jacky Forsyth: She's an associate professor at the School of Health, Science and Wellbeing, Staffordshire University. She focuses on developing research and study on women in sport and exercise."可知, Jacky Forsyth 专注于发展女性在运动和健身方面的研究。故选 C。
- 23. A 推理判断题。根据文章的语境可知,文章应该节选自一篇广告。故选 A。

【文章大意】本文是一篇记叙文。本文主要介绍了作者安置一只老龄狗的故事。

- 24. D 段落大意题。通读本段可知,当 Magdalen 需要一个临时的家的时候,这家人给了它一个家,但是他们有孩子和其他狗狗,他们不能给它一个永远的家,Magdalen 也老了,病了。所以本段主要介绍了 Magdalen 遇到的问题。
- 25. C 细节理解题。根据第一段中的"my husband and I drove a dog to her new home. Typically, when we have a new dog in the backseat, it's a young dog"和下文作者找兽医为 Magdalen 治病,并最终为 Magdalen 找到收养者可知,作者的工作是为狗狗找新家。
- 26. A 细节理解题。根据文章第三段可知,年迈的 Magdalen 虽然被原来的主人抛弃了,但作者的一个关心老 狗狗的好朋友答应收养它,她在开车送 Magdalen 去朋友家的路上是感到欣慰和开心的。
- 27. A 推理判断题。根据最后一段可知, Magdalen 原来的主人生病时, 他需要一些临时帮助, 但是当他康复后却不想要它回去了。作者想起了自己的狗和在过去因年老而失去的狗。作者认为他们是一家人, 永远都是这样。故作者无法理解 Magdalen 的主人的行为。

【文章大意】本文是一篇说明文,主要对一本儿童书籍的内容、写作风格和语言特点等方面作了评价。

- 28. B 推理判断题。根据第一段中的"The story starts with the boy, and the tree being the best of friends and having fun. As the boy grows older, he asks more from the tree, which willingly agrees until all that is left is a stump. In the end, the boy, now an old man, comes back to the tree and tells it that all he wants is a place to sit on, something that the tree eagerly provides."可推断,这本书主要介绍一个小男孩和一棵树之间的友谊。
- 29. B 推理判断题。根据第二段最后一句和第三段可知,这本书使用非常简单的短语和词汇,所以非常容易理解,即它简单易懂的语言使之适合小孩子阅读。
- 30. D 细节理解题。根据最后一段中的"Though the book has been criticized as it can be understood in different ways, it is because of this that the book succeeds."可知,不同的人对这本书有不同的理解,也就是说不同的人对这本书反映的道理有不同的理解,故使这本书很受欢迎。
- 31. A 推理判断题。本文介绍了一本儿童书籍的内容、写作风格和语言特点等,由此可知,作者的写作目的是为了对一本书作出评价。

【文章大意】本文是一篇说明文。火星上曾经有液态水,这是怎么形成的呢?科学家们提出了新的理论。

- 32. A 细节理解题。根据第一段的"The surface of Mars is etched with ancient river valleys and lake basins. Some researchers think that liquid water once flowed on the Red Planet."可知,火星表面有着古老的河谷和湖泊盆地,这使得研究人员认为液态水曾经在火星上流动。
- 33. C 细节理解题。根据第二段的"But Kasting, a geologist at Penn State University, thinks warm windows from such dramatic events would have been too brief to carve the vast canyons that exist on Mars"可知,但是 宾夕法尼亚州立大学的地质学家卡萨丁认为,剧烈变动带来的温暖期太过短暂,不足以形成火星上巨大的峡谷。
- 34. B 词义猜测题。根据第三段的"warm temperatures and abundant water would also have sped up certain chemical reactions that consumed carbon dioxide"可知,温暖的气候和充足的水也会加速某些化学反应,这样就消耗了二氧化碳。二氧化碳减少了就会减少温室效应,从而使地球温度下降。
- 35. C 标题归纳题。文章主要介绍的是气候的变化周期可能造成了火星上的峡谷。其余选项则过于片面。故选 C。

【文章大意】本文是一篇说明文。城市中的很多人需要寻找公寓租住,通过科学的规划、调查和分析,找到合适的公寓是完全可能的。本文就此给出了几点建议。

- 36. D D项意思为"你只需要知道一些重要的找房技巧",空后内容指出这样你就可以很容易地找到一间适合你的公寓,在语义上承接 D项内容。
- 37. G 选项 G 意思为"如果你最终选择一个你几乎负担不起的地方,你将承受维持收支平衡的压力",空后内容指出所以让我们把这部分做好,在语义上承接 G 项内容,形成因果关系。
- 38. A 本空所填句子为段落的主旨。本段主要阐述寻找公寓时有许多个人的喜好。要考虑到这些因素,探索社区并选择一个最合适的。A项意思为"决定你想要的位置",体现了本段的主旨大意。
- 39. C 空前内容指出不要租你看到的第一套公寓, C 项意思为"尝试考察至少两个或三个地方, 以便进行比较", 在语义上承接前文内容。
- 40. F 空前内容指出你可以自己做或者邀请一些朋友来帮助你。F 项意思为"有不同的观点总是好的,他们可能会看到你忽略的东西",在语义上对前文的建议做出解释。此外,they 对应前文的 some friends。

【文章大意】本文是一篇记叙文。本文主要讲述了年近百岁的老太太 Gwen Erickson 努力拯救濒危的帝王蝶的故事。

- 41. A 根据本空前的"raise 27 butterflies"可知,此处是说蝴蝶的数量(number)增加到了 61 只。
- 42. D 一些人认为应让自然去维持(sustain)其自身的运转,不应人为地干涉。
- 43. B 根据文章首句中的"one of America's most popular, yet endangered, butterflies—the Monarch"可知,这种蝴蝶的数量正在迅速减少(declining)。
- 44. C 值得庆幸的是(Thankfully),这种爱和奉献正是这位 97 岁的老人能够给予(provide)她的蝴蝶朋友们的。
- 45. D 根据下文"A fortnight later the beautiful butterfly \_\_\_\_\_."可知,整个过程有点耗时(time-consuming)。
- 46. B 根据语境可知,这里是指毛毛虫最终破"蛹"而出,化为美丽的蝴蝶。turn up 意为"出现",符合语境。
- 47. D 根据下文的"by flying around the house"可知,在 Erickson 将她所养的帝王蝶放飞之后,有一些似乎有点不愿意(unwilling)离开。
- 48. A 那些不愿离开的帝王蝶一直绕着 Erickson 的房子飞舞, 陪伴着(accompanied)它们的"恩人"。
- 49. C 根据本空后的"her first attempt to raise the butterflies"可知,这里是指 Erickson 回忆(recalling)她第一次试着去养帝王蝶时的情形。
- 50. B 根据空后内容可推知,最初 Erickson 试着去养帝王蝶是希望她的孙辈们能够对这一美丽的物种产生 (develop)兴趣。
- 51. B 通常 Erickson 不喜欢谈论自己和她所做的事情,但她现在这么做了,是希望能够鼓励(encourage)其他 人一起来关注这一濒临灭绝的物种。
- 52. A 此处指她喜欢做的事,即拯救帝王蝶。
- 53. C 根据本空前的 hopefully 以及上文的"Last year the grandmother managed to raise 27 butterflies and this year the \_\_\_\_\_ has gone up to 61."可知,经过人们的努力拯救,这一正在急剧减少的物种的数量有望出现变化(change)
- 54. A 本空后的"started so late in life"与文章的首句相呼应,由此可知,此处指 Erickson 养帝王蝶这一爱好 (hobby)。
- 55. D 老太太在九十七岁的高龄还在为拯救帝王蝶这一濒危物种忙碌,这是有目标的(purposeful)生活的体现。所以,Erickson的举动也提醒我们,为了目标而努力多晚都不迟。

【文章大意】本文是一篇说明文。在美国,高中生会在一月结束大学申请,但疫情改变了他们的申请方式。

- 56. in 考查介词。take part 后有宾语时,需用介词 in。
- 57. their 考查代词。此处应用形容词性物主代词修饰 college application。
- 58. personally 考查副词。空格中所填词修饰动词 talk,故应填副词形式。
- 59. written 考查非谓语动词。此处为过去分词作定语,修饰名词 applications,意为"书面的"。
- 60. introduction 考查词性转换。此处应用名词作宾语,故填 introduction。
- 61. whose 考查定语从句。分析句子结构可知,此处缺少关系词,先行词是 One student,关系词在定语从句中充当定语,故填 whose。
- 62. to go 考查非谓语动词。be eager to do sth. 表示"渴望做某事"。
- 63. has been 考查时态。根据时间状语"over the last 10 months"可知,该句应用现在完成时。
- 64. and 考查连词。此处表示并列关系,故用连词 and。
- 65. completing 考查非谓语动词。介词后应用动词-ing 形式作宾语,故填 completing。
