When Freddie Fuller arrived to perform in the hospital room in Temple, Texas, Pam Golightly worried it was already too late. Her stepfather, Dennis Strobel, at 88, was dying. After spending five days by his side, Golightly could tell his time was near. "You're probably wasting your time," Golightly told Fuller. But Fuller shared with her what medical professionals had told him time and time again over the years: Hearing may be the last sense to go. "Let me go in and play," Fuller said. "It's as much for you as it is for him."

Fuller, 68 and a full-time musician, is known professionally as the Singing Cowboy. Growing up in Salado, Texas, Fuller heard gospel (福音) music all the time from his mother, who encouraged his musical talent. When she was dying of cancer, in 1987, he put their love of song to its greatest use. He would crawl into her hospital bed with his guitar and sing her favorites. His mother seemed to relax, with a peaceful look crossing her face. "That moment allowed her and me to connect like we used to when I was singing as a kid," Fuller recalls. It emphasized to him the power of music. Consciously or subconsciously, people allow it to go to deep, sacred parts of their hearts and souls, Fuller believes.

So hearing about a nonprofit organization called Swan Songs, he gave them a call and signed up on the spot. Since 2005, Swan Songs has arranged more than 800 free musical last wishes. That was the case with Golightly's stepfather, who enjoyed country music, and Fuller was sent.

Golightly watched her stepdad's every breath, holding one of his hands while Fuller played some songs, one after another. "I played the last song, sang the last note, and hit the last guitar chord, and he took his last breath in peace, which reinforced my faith in the choice of this voluntary service," Fuller says. "It was a gift for us all," Golightly says of Fuller's act. "At a really sad time, it was beautiful."

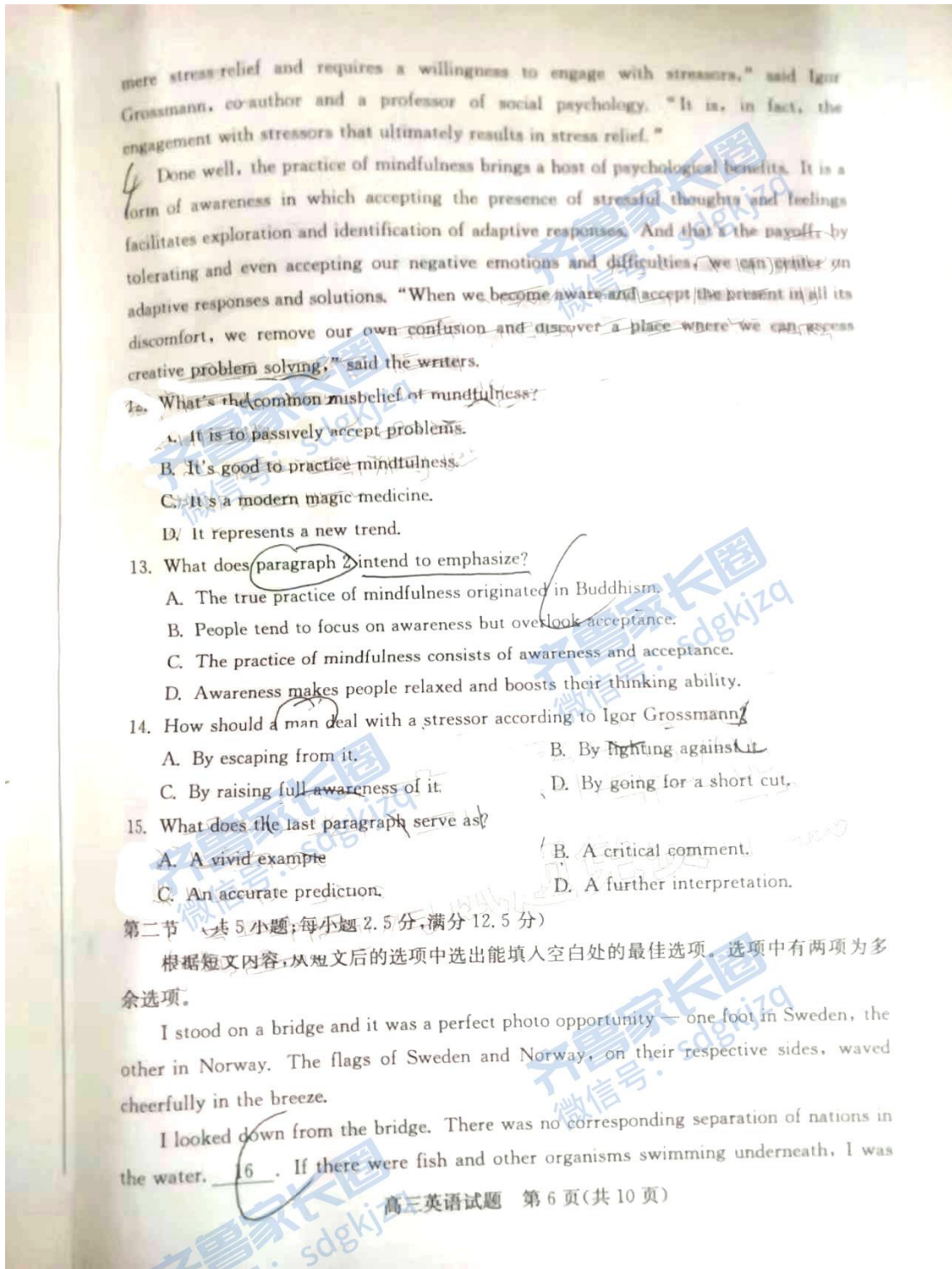

1 | Considered as a modern magic medicine, mindfulness is everywhere. Just about everyone is into it or thinks they should be. But new research finds that most of the public confuse mindfulness with passively accepting problems. And that means most people who practice mindfulness are missing out on the best of its mental health benefits.

2 | The true practice of mindfulness, which originated in Buddhism, has two parts: awareness and acceptance. Awareness is the meta-cognitive (元认知) process of observing the present moment, including our own emotions and thoughts in the moment. Without doubt, awareness is tremendously helpful, both as a tool for relaxation and for growth in our thinking. But that's where most people stop. "Our results suggest that ordinary people may understand what awareness is," said Ellen Choi, lead author on the paper. The issue for Choi is that the next step, acceptance, is not well understood.

3 | Acceptance involves a profound engagement with a problem and all its attendant negative emotions. True mindfulness is a lot more than simply becoming fully aware of a stressor; it means combating with that stressor, without avoiding it or going for a short cut. Mindfulness is hard work. "Scientific understanding of mindfulness goes beyond
