Amel Jandrisevits knows the value of a good doll. "Lolls have a power we don't completely understand," she told The Today Show. It's a conclusion she came to while working as a pediatric oncology (儿童肿瘤学) social worker using dolls to help her young clients adapt to their changing medical situations. Many of the kids saw themselves in those dolls. But for the kids missing a limb or who had lost their hair, there were none they could relate to. So, seven years ago, when a friend revealed that her child was obese, Jandrisevits, now 49, knew what might help the youth through this potentially challenging period. "It's hard to tell a kid, 'You are perfect the way you are,' and to build self-esteem that way, without offering them anything that looks like them," she says. Jandrisevits went about changing that. She crafted a doll by hand—using



fabric, stitching, and markers—that resembled her friend’s child and sent it off. After the friend posted a photo online of the happy child and doll, another woman asked Jandrisevits to make a doll that looked like her baby, who was missing a leg. Word spread, and soon Jandrisevits was making dolls for children with scars, birthmarks, facial deformities, tracheotomies—in short, a doll that looked like them.

Jandrisevits quit her job and started a nonprofit organization, A Doll Like Me. Working out of her home in Milwaukee, from photos sent by parents or caregivers, it takes Jandrisevits roughly seven hours to craft each doll. A GoFundMe page helps her offset costs and allows her to donate her services. She hasn’t charged for a doll since she began her nonprofit. In all, she’s made more than 400 dolls.

The waiting list is long, but Jandrisevits is unbowed. As she explains on her GoFundMe page, “Every kid, regardless of gender, ethnicity, age, medical issue, or body type, should look into the sweet face of a doll and see their own.”

Betsy Holden was vice-president of strategy and new products at Kraft, a giant food company, when she became pregnant for the second time. “No one has ever done the job with two children,” her male boss worried. “How many children do you have?” Ms. Holden asked. “Two,” he replied.

The second wave of women, born between 1974 and 1985, had female colleagues in upper management, expected (and usually received) support from their spouses, and often benefited from employer benefits, such as maternity leave (产假) and flexible working. The earlier generation, by blazing the trail made it easier for those behind them. A Harvard Business School study shows that adult daughters of employed mothers are more likely to hold management responsibility and earn higher incomes while sons are likely to spend more time caring for family members. And companies are now much



more willing to promote women, who make up more than a fifth of senior executive positions in American firms, compared with just 10% in 1996.

Despite the advances made by female executives, things are even more difficult for the vast majority of working mothers. Many work in smaller businesses, where maternity benefits and flexible hours are less likely to be available. Many are in low-paid jobs, or in sectors like health care and retailing, where it has been impossible to work remotely during the pandemic. The author writes that "nothing is more essential to an employed mother's professional success than reliable high-quality child care", and for many women who are not executives; this is a constant headache.

There needs to be a lot more progress made in helping the vast majority of women to juggle their home and work lives, not least by providing affordable child care.

"Live in the moment" is a cultural mantra of our time. And yet this well-intentioned message runs against our biology. Humans were not made to hold fast to the present all the time. Research shows that we spend one-third to one-half of our waking life not living in the space to imagine, remember, reflect and then use these fantasies to solve problems, innovate and create. Many scientists see this as one of the central evolutionary advances that distinguish human beings from other species.

But introspection can sometimes lead to more harm than good, contributing to anxiety and depression. When we focus inward to work through our problems we may find that doing so causes us to feel worse. This internal chatter(喋喋不休)-negative thought



circles—can make our capacity for introspection feel more like a burden than a blessing. We think about that mess at work, or a misunderstanding with a loved one—and we end up flooded by how bad we feel.

Then we think about it again.

And again.

Introspection is both a helpful tool and destructive force. Fortunately, science has begun to explain how to handle it.

One natural solution to this problem is to “step back” from your problems so you can think about them more objectively. When the Hollywood star Jennifer Lawrence became uncomfortable during an interview in 2015, she used a simple but effective strategy to regain perspective. She said to herself, “OK, get ahold of yourself, Jennifer.” By addressing herself by name she talked to herself like she was speaking to someone else. Most people find it easier to advise other people than themselves. When a problem isn't happening to you, it's easier to remain objective.

Introspection is central to the makeup of the human mind. The challenge is to minimize the negative aspects of that essential feature while maximizing its potential.

In Kenya, at the wheel is Eunice Benedict, 30, a member of East Africa's first all-female ranger (园林管理员) unit, Team Lioness. She 41 some giraffes, then some elephants with a calf.
