21.A 细节理解题。从 Some people view *The Seagull* as a tragic(悲剧的) play about always unhappy people. Others see it as a humorous and bitter book, making fun of humans' foolishness.可知,有人把这本书看成是不幸的人的悲剧,有人把它看成是对人类愚蠢的嘲弄。

22.C 细节理解题。从 A simple-minded young man, *Candide* is sure his world is the best of all worlds, but a trip around the world opens his eyes about what he believes to be true.可知,是一次环球旅行让 *Candide* 改变了对完美世界的看法。

23.D 细节理解题。从 a young African American girl who dreams of having blue eyes—a sign of acceptance in a world ruled by white conceptions(概念) of beauty.可知,这是一本关于一个女孩想把眼睛变成白人认为最美的蓝色的故事。

本文是记叙文。全文讲述了美国纽约的 Alexander 和 Andrea Campagna 在暴风雨夜收留了九名韩国游客,后来他们一家人应邀去韩国旅游,受到礼遇的事情。

25.A 细节理解题。从第二段 The visit included a series of Korean culture as well as its natural beauty. The Campagnas went to the 14th-century Gyeongbokgung Palace, walked through Gwanghwamun Square, and generally received the star treatment. 等信息可知,每到一处, Campagnas 一家都受到贵宾式的接待。

26.B 推理判断题。从第三段 There were happy tears; but most of all, there was gratitude. Everyone felt like the chance meeting was fate(命运).可知,无论是9名韩国游客,还是 Campagnas 一家都感激命运的安排。

27.D 推理判断题。全文讲述了 Campagnas 一家在暴风雨夜收留了9名韩国游客后应邀到韩国旅游受到礼遇的事情,因此 D 最能概括。

28.A 细节理解题。从第一段 These actions can strengthen the verbal(口头的) messages you're sending or it can lead to mistrust or confusion—signs of poor communication and misunderstanding.可知,如果身势语与我们语言不一致,就有可能传递不信任或者困惑的信息。

29.B 推理判断题。从第二段 Some nonverbal signs unintentionally communicate parts of ourselves that we don't want others to know. 可以推断出,作者举例说明有些非语言性的符号能展现真实的一面。

30.C 推理判断题。从最后两段作者讲述的合适的身势语能让我们展现自信的一面可推断,合适的身体语言能在自信中帮助我们。

31.D 主旨大意题。全文讲述了身体语言在帮助我们沟通上的作用。

M: Shakespeare Globe Theater is the world's largest theater that is devoted to the famous playwright Shakespeare in London. The first Globe Theater was built in 1599. Then it was destroyed by fire in 1613, but a second Globe Theater was built on the same site by the following June. The modern reconstruction of it opened in 1997, about 230 meters from the site of the original theater.

The theater brings Shakespeare's life to the world, using modern technology, like TV programs and picture displays, so the exhibition is most attractive to tourists. It includes a guided tour of the theater, and opens from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm daily. Admission charges are 8 pounds for adults, 6 for senior citizens and 5 pounds for children aged five to fifteen. A family ticket is available for 23 pounds. This includes two adults and three children. Groups of fifteen or more must book in advance. The Globe Theater season has finished this year.
