This is a cosmic adventure in a very literal sense, as our young hero, Torris, tries to survive on a comet made entirely of ice.

This book launched the legend of an orphaned boy who is adopted by apes in the African jungle. Named Tarzan, the boy eventually has to prove himself on two fronts: the animal kingdom and the even more threatening world of humans.

Raptor Red by Robert T. Bakker

Unlike any other book out there, Raptor Red is told entirely from the third-person point of view of Raptor Red, a female Utahraptor. Robert T. Bakker, the author, expertly draws upon heartfelt research about the Cretaceous Period to bring a prehistoric Earth to life as Raptor Red struggles to survive in a dinosaur-eatdinosaur world.

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A man called Jamaal Allan has revealed how his name has led to him being racially stereotyped (相类) throughout his life.

Jamaal, a high school teacher who grew up in southern Oregon of the USA, revealed that most people he meets are always surprised when they discover he's white. He said that one of the most common responses to his name is "I never would've guessed your name was Jamaal". In a blog post he aired his thoughts on this. Writing: "Really, are you frequently good at guessing people's names?" Another reaction to his name, he said. is "you don't look like a Jamaal", to which he asked in response, "And how exactly does one look like a name?"

He wrote in the blog that some people, after meeting him, say "I thought you'd be..." and then pause with "a sudden realization they are on the verge of sounding racist", before finding a word such as "taller" or "older" to end the sentence with.

And his name once appeared to get him selected for a random security check on a trip to London in 2002, as the others picked out by officials were called Muhammad, Abdul and Tariq. He also explained that waitresses and waiters usually hand his credit card back to a black person at his table when he's dining out.

5 His name, which means "beauty" in Arabic, landed him his teaching job in Iowa, though. Januarl said, "The principal who had hired me admitted that I was lucky to have gotten the job. They had not been planning to take another student-teacher when my application showed up. But, as they scanned through it and saw a Jamaal who plays basketball and counts Muhammad Ali among his heroes, they thought they 'could use a little diversity,'" said Jamaal.

Jamaal's dad was a fan of the Los Angeles Lakers basketball team and he was just named after one of their players, Jamaal Wilkes.

"If you want to own a home, stop buying brunch," they say, Meanwhile, under 30s are at risk of injury from the world's biggest eye roll (白眼).

But it is not tasty food like avocado, fast fashion or even travel abroad that's holding a generation back from achieving those traditional milestones - and we finally have some evidence to prove it. In fact, those aged 18 to 30 are more likely to be savers than any other age group, according to new research. Far from being wasteful, an overwhelming 84% of these young people are trying to save.

The real problem lies in the fact that younger people tend to have higher expense when spending on essentials compared to our older counterparts (对应的人) - and that house prices are at an all-time high.

The research also finds that nearly half (47%) of 18 to 30-year-olds have "low financial resilience" they have little capacity to pay bills in the event of a financial shock.

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Young people are significantly more likely to have fallen behind on domestic bills and credit card repayments in the past six months, at 31%, compared with 3% of those aged 51-plus, the research finds.

"Despite the criticism that young people often face, regularly accused of spending too much money on coffees and food and not being financially prudent (特別的), our new research shows just how much young people are trying to look after their finances and save for the future—more so than any other age group," said Ben Glover, the lead author of the research,

"Amid a cost of living crisis, younger people still face the greatest battle with the highest spending on essentials, a lack of support and a system that doesn't work for them."

Ben also says it's time for the Government, policymakers and financial institutions to urgently work together to help improve young people's financial well-being and prospects, especially after the pandemic. So there we are: nothing to do with avocado.

White was one of the first colors used in art in the 15th century, and one would think that there is little room left to improve its "whiteness". It turns out that is far from the case. A team of researchers led by Xiulin Ruan, a professor at Purdue University, recently revealed an "ultra-white" paint that they believe could even help fight climate change.

The scientists, who spent six years creating the world's "whitest white" paint, claim that the white paints currently available make surfaces warmer rather than cooler. That's because they only reflect 80 to 90 percent of the sunlight and cannot make surfaces cooler than the surrounding temperature. The newly-revealed ultrawhite paint not only reflects 98.1 percent of sunlight, but also prevents surface infrared (红外线的) heat from being absorbed.

"Our paint absorbs 1.9% of sunlight, but those commercial paints absorb 10% of the sunlight - five times as much as our paint absorbs," Dr. Ruan says. "They look white, they are pretty white, but they aren't white enough - they're not able to cool beyond the surrounding temperature."

Outdoor tests of the new paint indicated it could keep surfaces 5°C cooler than the surrounding temperature under the strong noon sunlight and as much as 10°C cooler at night.

"We did a very rough calculation," Dr. Ruan told a news reporter. "And we estimate we would only need to paint 1 percent of the Earth's surface with this paint - perhaps an area where no people live that is covered in rocks - and that could help fight the climate change trend."

However, Hashem Akbari, professor of building at Concordia University, believes the paint's real benefits can only be proved after being in use for a few years. "Dirt and dust tend to decrease the reflectivity of the surface," Akbari said. "If it starts with 95% reflectivity, the pollutants from the air could collect on the surface, and they decrease the reflectivity."

Paige Winter stood in waist-deep water when a shark suddenly appeared and pounced (猛扑) on her just three feet from her ___41__, Charlie Winter, a firefighter and former Marine. The 17-year-old suffered severe injuries from the ___42__ earlier this month at North Carolina's Fort Macon State Park.

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
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
