Jazmine Sullivan, "Heaux Tales"

Sullivan rose to the top of the R&B charts in 2008. Her new album, "Heaux Tales", was released on Jan. 8. Much of the album was recorded in Sullivan's Philadelphia home due to the COVID-19 lockdown. The R&B star is set to get some major exposure at this year's Super Bowl on Feb. 7, where she'll sing the national anthem.

Olivia Newton-John, "Window in the Wall"

Olivia Newton-John released this song on Jan. 22 with her daughter Chloe Rose Lattanzi. "I played the song and I started crying. It was really emotional," the Australian artist said. "It was just a

Selena Gomez, "De Una Vez"

Gomez, a Texas native, sang in Spanish on her latest single, "De Una Vez" ("At Once"), which dropped on Jan. 14. It's the first track from her upcoming album, "Revelación," ("Revelation") which is due out on May 12. It'll be Gomez's first Spanish-language album.

Justin Bieber, "Anyone"

Bieber started the new year with a fresh new song. "Anyone" was officially released on Jan. 1. Fans had been eagerly looking forward to its debut (首发). "Anyone" was one of several songs Bieber performed during his New Year's Eve broadcast. Bieber's last album, "Changes", dropped last year on Valentine's Day.

In the Great Hall of the People in Beijing, hundreds of journalists were holding lights, cameras and voice recorders as they tried to find strategic positions at group interviews.

Each speaker was allowed only a short time. Everyone laughed because Professor Zhu Youyong carried along a big potato during his two minutes.

“Farmers in China’s poor areas can rely on agricultural science to strive for a well-off life,” said the 63-year-old plant-disease expert.

Professor Zhu is nicknamed “potato scholar”. Born into a family of farmers in Yunnan, Zhu said he has an attachment with the land. Since 2016, Zhu’s team has promoted agricultural science in Lancang, Yunnan province.

Zhu said farmers in the area only planted rice once a year. After the harvest, the rice fields stayed unused for the entire winter. In 2016, his team launched a pilot program, a program which was used to test the idea of growing a late-season potato crop.

Success soon arrived, with about 3.1 tons of potatoes harvested in a field covering just one mu (0.07 hectare), which brought income to farmers of about 9,000 yuan (\$1,420). Then in 2017, Zhu expanded cultivation (栽培) in several villages in the county, benefiting more than 1,000 families.

“We have set a goal of helping every poor farmer in the county to earn 10,000 yuan out of each mu of farmland cultivated each winter, so as to lift farmers out of poverty (贫困),” Zhu said.

“Ultimately, I am a farmer. Going back to the fields and seeing how my research changed the lives of farmers in China is the most important thing to me,” he said.

A New Zealand council (市议会) has announced a month-long road closure in order to allow a sea lion and her pup to reach the ocean safely.

John Wilson Ocean Drive in Dunedin will be closed after the New Zealand sea lions made their home at a nearby golf course (球场) and started “regularly crossing the road to get to the beach,” according to a Facebook post from Dunedin City Council.

“You can still visit the area on foot or by bicycle, but please give the sea lions lots of space,” continued the post.

Locals applauded the decision, and one even called for the closure to be made permanent.

“No dogs should be on the beach, either,” wrote Gaylene Smith. “We need to protect our beautiful sea life.”

Dogs are known to attack sea lions, and Chisholm Links Golf Course, where the sea lions have made their home, also posted advice to dog walkers in a Facebook update.

“We’re lucky to have sea lions on our coastline and we need to share the space with them, as this is what makes our coastline so unique!” wrote the council on Facebook.

The council went on to explain that New Zealand sea lions are endangered, and are one of the world’s rarest species of sea lion.

There are an estimated 12,000 New Zealand sea lions left, according to the Department of Conservation. Under local law, anyone who kills a sea lion could face up to two years in prison or a fine of up to NZ\$250,000 (US\$178,000).

This year, new technologies will enable more drivers to take their hands off the steering wheel (方向盘) while on the road. But that doesn't mean their cars will be fully self-driving — that day still remains far in the future.

Automakers like General Motors (GM), Ford and Stellantis are introducing, or upgrading existing technologies. But in the words of Kay Stepper, an automated driving expert, these systems are “feet off” and “hands off”, but they will not be “eyes off” or “mind off”.

For the time being, these systems will only be used on limited-access highways, where there are no pedestrians or bicyclists. Vehicles with this technology will be able to drive at relatively high speeds, but only in simple traffic situations.

Bryan Reimer, a researcher with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's AgeLab, said it will be decades before people can buy truly self-driving cars in which humans ride as passengers.

Still, the technology that will be rolled out by the major automakers this year will do more than most so-called Advanced Driver Assistance Systems, or ADAS, do now.

GM's Super Cruise system allows drivers to completely let go of the steering wheel while driving on selected highways. It was introduced in 2017 on the Cadillac CT6 sedan, which was discontinued last year. An improved version is coming this year on the Cadillac Escalade SUV and the Cadillac CT4 and CT5 sedans.

Super Cruise only works on highways that have been previously laser-mapped in three dimensions. GPS positioning and the vehicles' radar sensors (传感器) and cameras are used to enable drivers to unhand — and unfoot — all the controls.

Drivers still need to pay attention, however. A camera in the car makes sure the driver is looking at the road at all times. If the driver looks away from the road for more than a few seconds, the system will stop working.

Every superhero, no matter how small, needs a cape (披风). That was Robyn Rosenberger's motivation when she started 21 superhero capes for kids with cancer, heart trouble, and other serious 22.

It all began when she was making a cape as a 23 for her nephew. Rosenberger heard of a girl named Brenna who was 24 a potentially deadly skin condition. Anyone going through what she was suffering had to be 25. "I had an impressive moment," Rosenberger says. "Brenna was a superhero! She 26 a cape."

So Rosenberger sent her one, and Brenna's mother was 27. Rosenberger found ten more kids online and 28 ten more capes. Before long, she 29 her job at a software company to dedicate herself full-time to tinysuperheroes.com. It's a 30 where people can buy handmade capes for 31 kids facing illness and 32.

Since 2013, Rosenberger and her small paid 33 have sent more than 12,000 handmade capes to 34 in all 50 states and 15 other countries. The capes come in different 35, like pink, blue, purple, or red and can be decorated with specialized patches, 36 a heart, a rocket, or a red sun.

One recipient was eight-month-old Gabe, who was born with a cleft palate (腭裂), which causes 37 facial features. Rosenberger sent him a red cape with a bright yellow G in the center. It was a hit. Gabe is now a fixture (固定人物) on the company's social media posts. "The TinySuperhero community has been a 38 connection to have," says Gabe's mom, Kate Glocke. "39, two years later, we 40 bring Gabe's cape with us to every hospital appointment".

The postponed Tokyo Olympics are due to open from July 23 to August 8, 2021. Actually, there 41 (be) much speculation (猜测) recently about whether the Tokyo Olympics will take place as scheduled. On Jan 27, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) President Thomas Bach promised that 42 event would go ahead. "Our task is to organize the Olympic Games and not to cancel the Olympic Games," he said, adding that the IOC is working day and night 43 (host) a safe event. But it's still 44 (clear) how this will happen, with coronavirus cases increasing around the world.
