Beautiful Dawn Redwood Forests(红杉林) in China

In today's China, dawn redwoods grow in areas to the south of Beijing. Thanks to its soft texture, the dawn redwood can be used for construction, floor decoration, paper making and so on. The best time to appreciate its beauty is from the end of November to the beginning of December.

Gutan Reservoir, Zhejiang province

Best viewing period: Late autumn

General admission: Free

Every late autumn, dawn redwood trees in the Cutan Reservoir, East China's Zhejiang province dress in gold clothes. The dawn redwood forest also draws many tourists to wander in the forest. It is famous among photography enthusiasts for its red pond cypress, so that in the autumn it is also a film shooting location.

Xiaohe Seedling Nursery of Dawn Redwood, Hubei province

Best viewing period: Late autumn

General admission: Free

As the hometown of the dawn redwood, Xiaohu in Lichuan city, Central China's Hubei province is a seedling nursery that is home to more than 5,000 dawn redwood trees listed for protection. The scene resembles a fairy-tale world and draws many photographers who would like to capture the magic.

Sihong Hongze Lake Wetland Scenic Area, Jiangsu province

Best viewing period: Late autumn and early winter

General admission: 60 yuan(\$9.19)/person

In the Sihong Hongze Lake Wetland Scenic Area, East China's Jiangsu province, the dawn redwood forest is dressed in gorgeous colors in early winter. From an aerial view, it looks like a spectacular red ocean. Covering 20 hectares, the dawn redwood forest is a heaven for wild animals and draws many nesting migratory birds.

Songhua Dam Reservoir, Yunnan province

Best viewing period: Early winter

General admission: Free

The early winter is the best season to view the dawn redwood forests in the upstream of the Songhua Dam Reservoir in Dianwei village, Kunming city. Nowadays, the protection zone is a habitat of migratory birds, with beautiful villages, clear water, and a good ecology. The dawn redwood forest has become a special calling card for local tourism.

B

When White met the pit bull puppy in 2018, Darby was young, playful, strong as an ox. Then, in the summer of 2019, came Darby's **date with destiny**.

White was fishing in Northern California's Bodega Bay. He left Darby, then a year old and 100 pounds, in the parked car with windows down, while he cast his line a few yards away. The fish weren't biting, White recalls, until, suddenly, they were.

At first, White thought he had hooked a stingray. But as he reeled(绕线) it in, he realized it was a sevengill shark, about 6 feet long. Not uncommon, but still dangerous. He brought it close and carefully unhooked it, expecting it to swim away. It didn't. The shark bit his ankle.

"All of a sudden there was blood everywhere," says White. He yelled for help, hoping the fishermen down the beach could hear. But they didn't seem to know what was going on. Fortunately, Darby did. He jumped out of the car and ran toward the water. He ran right up to the shark and sank his teeth into its gills(鱼鳃).

"That just made the shark bite down harder," White says. Darby backed off, then regrouped and attacked the shark's tail. The shark released its grip(紧抓), and White managed to push it into shallow water, where it swam off. "The whole thing took less than a minute," White says, "but it left plenty of damage." White was able to stop the bleeding and get to a hospital, where he learned that the wound was very severe.

That would've been the end of it, had Darby's story not gone viral. White was contacted by NBC News and CNN. That's when the countless cash offers started to come in. But the big dog was not for sale.

On June 15, the 100-day countdown to the Hangzhou Asian Games, the medal of the 19th Asian Games was released. The medal of the 19th Asian Games is named Shan Shui, which is another core element of the Asian Games, along with the official emblem(徽章) Tides Surging, mascots Congcong, Chenchen, Lianlian, color system Meeting the World and torch Eternal Flame. It is an important addition to the overall aesthetic of the event.

Shan Shui is characterized by the ceremonial jade (玉) Cong in the Liangzhu Culture (5,300BC-4,300BC). This square jade, integrated with a round medal, is truly unique and highly recognizable.

Shan Shui presents the geographical features of Hangzhou. By using prominent lines, the picture scroll of Hangzhou is outlined on the front side of the medal with misty hills on three sides and the city on one side, a rippling lake, and wavelike mountains beyond. The back side is shaped like a square seal, which means the athletes leave a beautiful mark on the Hangzhou Asian Games.

Shan Shui expresses the character of Hangzhou as the capital of ecological civilization, with natural landscape, clear water and green hills, creating invaluable assets, casting gold and silver medals.

Shan Shui shows the sportsmanship of climbing the heights. Reaching the top, one will become even higher. On the way to the summit, athletes strive hard, challenge themselves, and overcome one peak after another.

The medal will be made by painting, milling, trimming and polishing, gold and silver plating effect treatment, and protection treatment. The medal ribbon will be hand-sewn on both sides using weave technology and environmentally friendly printing techniques. The bridge-shaped buckle at the top of the ribbon highlights the Jiangnan characteristics of the water town and the bridge town. The linking method adopts the raw ear structure of the spring buckle shaft(弹簧扣轴) to fix the ribbon inside the medal.

Virtual reality (VR) is already widespread in various fields. But while vision and hearing interfaces(接口) are extremely advanced, and touch, or “haptics,” is improving, one key sense has been missing from the virtual world: smell.

That may be about to change. Engineer Xinge Yu of the City University of Hong Kong and his colleagues have developed a lightweight, flexible and wireless smell interface that can precisely deliver smells such as pineapple or green tea to VR users and more fully immerse them in scented virtual worlds.

Previous smell interfaces have typically used bottles of liquid perfume, an atomizer (a device that turns liquids into a fine mist) and some method of blowing the atomized droplets out. This works, but it is rigid and has limited operating time between refills, and it does not easily allow for controlling intensity. These drawbacks have made the devices less practical for VR systems.

The new design uses small wax pads filled with scents that are heated by an electrode(电极) to release a smell. A thermistor senses the temperature, which controls the smell’s intensity. The study describes two different device formats. The first is small enough that it can be stuck to a user’s top lip, but it includes only two smell generators. The second is worn like a face mask and has nine. Both are customizable with a selection of 30 smells, including ginger, clove, mojito and coconut milk. Different combinations can be blended at varying intensities to create thousands of possible fragrances.

The study includes demonstrations of possible applications beyond just enhancing VR, including communicating messages by smell and arousing emotions. The researchers suggest the devices could even be used to ease depressed mood or promote recall in people with age-related cognitive decline. “Scent is directly connected to the emotional and memory parts of the brain, so there are a lot of applications related to well-being and health,” Amores says.
