### 书面表达评分建议

#### 第一节（满分 15 分）

##### 一、评分原则

1. 本题总分为15分，按5个档次给分。
2. 评分时，先根据文章的内容和语言初步确定其所属档次，然后以该档次的要求衡量、确定或调整档次，最后给分。
3. 词数少于60和多于100的，从总分中减去2分。
4. 评分时，应注意内容要点、应用词汇和语法结构的丰富性和准确性及上下文的连贯性。
5. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面，评分时，应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑。英美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。
6. 如字迹难以辨认，以致影响交际，将分数降低一个档次。

第二档 (4-6分)	未恰当完成试题规定的任务。信息未能清楚地传达给读者。
	1. 漏掉或未描述清楚一些主要内容,写了一些无关内容。 2. 语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。 3. 有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响了对写作内容的理解。 4. 较少使用语句间的连接成分,内容缺少连贯性。
第一档 (1-3分)	未完成试题规定的任务。信息未能传达给读者。
	1. 明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,原因可能是未理解试题要求。 2. 语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。 3. 较多语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响对写作内容的理解。 4. 缺乏语句间的连接成分,内容不连贯。
不得分 (0分)	未能传达给读者任何信息:内容太少,无法评判;写的内容均与所要求内容无关或所写内容无法看清。

## 第二节(满分25分)

### 一、写作思路

本文以人物为线索展开,讲述了作者的女儿简梦想成为歌手,在她的音乐老师玛丽的帮助下,简为了她的梦想努力取得进步。突然有一天,简遭遇了车祸,以后都不能自己站起来了,必须坐轮椅四处走动,简再也没有提过唱歌的话题。

①由第一段首句内容“然而,有一天,玛丽带来了好消息。”可知,第一段可描写玛丽告诉简希望她代表班级唱歌,简在玛丽的帮助下继续练习,终于可以展示自己了。

②由第二段首句内容“当主持人宣布轮到简时,她被推上了舞台。”可知,第二段可描写简的歌声得到了老师和同学们的赞扬,简重新找回了最初追求梦想的信心。。

### 二、评分标准

**1、评分原则:** 给分公平、公正;宽严并济,不能过严或过松;得分有理,扣分有据。

**2、评分标准:** 立意积极、情节合理、语言风格与前文一致、书写美观。

**三个逻辑一致原则:** 续写部分与所给短文之间的逻辑;续写两段内容之间的逻辑;续写部分与所给开头语之间的逻辑。

### 3、评分程序:

阅读第1遍:根据续写总体情节及重点内容描写,初步确定所属档次。

阅读第2遍:根据写作语言(修辞、句式,词汇等),确定或调整档次。

阅读第3遍:看词数(少于130个,从总分中扣2分);看书写(书写及卷面较差的建议降为三档或三档以下)。

#### 4、评分原则

本题总分为 25 分，按 5 个档次给分。

档次	描述
第五档 (21—25)	—与所给短文融洽度高，与所提供各段落开头语衔接合理。 —内容丰富。 —所使用语法结构和词汇丰富、准确，可能有些许错误，但完全不影响意义表达。 —有效地使用了语句间的连接成分，使所续写短文结构紧凑。
第四档 (16—20)	—与所给短文融洽度较高，与所提供各段落开头语衔接较为合理。 —内容比较丰富。 —所使用语法结构和词汇较为丰富、准确，可能有些许错误，但不影响意义表达。 —比较有效地使用了语句间的连接成分，使所续写的短文结构紧凑。
第三档 (11—15)	—与所给短文关系较为密切，与所提供各段落开头语有一定程度的衔接。 —写出了若干有关内容。 —应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求，但错误较多，出现 5 个以上大错，但仍能传递有关信息。 —应用简单的语句间连接成分，使全文内容连贯。
第二档 (6—10)	—与所给短文有一定的关系，与所提供各段落开头语有一定程度的衔接。 —写出了一些有关内容。 —语法结构单调，词汇项目有限，有些语法结构和词汇方面的错误，影响了意义的表达。 —较少使用语句间的连接成分，全文内容缺少连贯性。
第一档 (1—5)	—与所提供短文和开头语的衔接较差。 —产出内容较少。 —语法结构单调，词汇项目很有限，有较多语法结构和词汇方面的错误，严重影响了意义的表达。 —缺乏语句间的连接成分，全文内容不连贯。

W: Have you heard about Ms. Jenkins? She's leaving the school next week.

M: Yes. I was really sad, but I understand she wants to live closer to her old parents.

W: I thought she was bored of teaching and had changed her job. After all, she can speak four languages. She can travel everywhere.

(Text 3)

W: I'd like to book three tickets for the film tonight, please.

M: That's fine. Can you collect them by 7 o'clock?

W: Yes, no problem.

(Text 4)

W: Excuse me, I'd like a cup of black coffee.

M: OK. You can read the books and magazines on that shelf before the coffee is served, madam.

W: That's good.

(Text 5)

M: Does the car need to be filled?

W: Mary stopped at the gas station on her way home.

(Text 6)

W: Do you take your dog for a walk every day?

M: No, my father takes the dog for a walk every Monday, Tuesday and Sunday. And I take the dog for a walk every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

M: Yeah, I'm doing my Ph.D. It's taking ages to finish and there is far too much to learn from the professors; kind of boring. How about you?

W: Good afternoon and welcome to Seattle Houseboat Tours. My name's Elizabeth Jones and I'm your guide today. This is my houseboat Moonlight. Before we go on board, I'd like to give you a little background information. Seattle has one of the largest numbers of houseboats in the U.S. — about 500 of them in fact. That's quite a high number and shows how popular houseboat living is here. We're at the southern end of Lake Union right now. As you have probably seen already, this is a lively area with restaurants and shops and cafes. During our one-hour tour you'll see a number of houseboats. People can pay millions of dollars for the biggest of these. Some of them are quite amazing and have two or three floors. My own is one of the smallest boats, but I still have plenty of room, as you'll see when I show you around. My living area includes one bedroom with a bathroom, a kitchen and a living room. I also have electricity, running water and network, so I really do have everything I need. You may be interested to know that I'm writing a book on the history of houseboats in the city, and this should be on sale from early July. Well, thank you for listening so far. Now let's move into the boat and start the tour.

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
