(Text 1)

W: Welcome, James. Let me get you a drink—can I get you some coffee or water?

22. A 细节理解题。根据 South Africa Program 中 "... this program is incredibly popular for those looking for a meaningful and social travel experience with easy access to surfing, hiking and even weekend safari tours." 可知, 在 South Africa Program 项目中, 参与者可以在周末徒步旅行。

23. B 细节理解题。根据 Guatemala Program 中 "Guatemala's incredible volcanoes, green rainforest, beautiful lakes and attractive cultural cities make this country a hit with nature and city lovers alike." 可知, Guatemala 的自然美景和文化城市使其大受参与者喜爱。

29. D 词义猜测题。根据画线词后"“People enjoy having their feelings and thoughts spoken back to them.”可推断,validate 的意思与 Prove 意思一致。
30. A 细节理解题。根据第五段“They found more recent popular songs were likelier to have avoidant attachment themes and less secure lyrics than older popular songs.”可知,老的流行歌曲的歌词更安心。
31. B 推理判断题。根据最后一段“Alaei believes this could be because people are less connected than they used to be. 'We've become more individualistic, and we feel lonelier these days than people used to several decades ago. Social media may, ironically, make people feel less connected,' he says.”可推断,音乐偏好可能反映了我们的个人生活。

These observations are significant, because the degree of care we give to animals seems to rely on how we picture their inner lives.”可推断,提到这三本书是因为它们都提醒我们来关注动物的情感。
33. D 细节理解题。根据第二段“We humans tend to judge and give consideration to other animals based on their smartness.”可知,我们通常根据动物的聪明程度来评判它们。
34. A 推理判断题。根据第三段“One well-documented case is of a mother elephant named Eleanor. Weakened by age, Eleanor kept collapsing, and a fellow elephant, Grace, kept trying to lift her onto her feet.”和“In one instance, a young, orphaned elephant moaned(呻吟) when it discovered the remains of its rhinoceros companion, killed by hunters.”可推断,大象具有高度的同情心。
35. C 推理判断题。根据最后一段“I suspect that, the more we learn about fish, birds, and even insects, we'll recognize further elemental similarities of feeling.”可推断,作者建议我们给予动物更多的理解。

60. came 考查动词时态。该句叙述的是过去发生的事情, 故用所给动词的过去式 came。
61. practising 考查非谓语动词。Besides 在此处为介词, 后跟动词的 ing 形式作其宾语。
62. the 考查冠词。根据后面的 same 可知, 该空需用定冠词 the。
63. parts 考查名词复数。part 为可数名词, 根据前面的 all 可知, 此处用其复数形式 parts。
64. of 考查介词。“a sense of...”意为“一种……感觉”, 故该空填 of。
65. focused 考查非谓语动词。分析该空成分可知, stay 在该句为系动词, 故用所给动词的过去分词作其表语。
