Her stepfather died in a car accident, leaving her mother to support three daughters on a modest income, Paying for college became out of the question.

One afternoon, Dorothy Clarks, her English teacher, walked into the classroom, handing out a paper sheet titled “ Mrs.Clark's Book List ” , and said, “Some of you might not go on to higher education, but you can continue to learn," She created a list of 153 fiction and nonfiction books, covering science, history, economics, politics, and

literature. It would, she believed, form the equivalent(等同) of two years at a liberal arts college.

So she began in 1970. Starting at the top, Steph would read every book in the order they appeared, Each of those books fueled her passion to learn more about the person, subject matter, or time in history. Unlike many people who open a book in bed before it's time to sleep, Steph prefers to read while sitting in a chair with a cup of coffee by her side. She doesn't race through a book, as she wants to savor the experience.

Now Steph is 70 and she never did get to college. But she has only four books left to read from the list, She expects to complete them sometime in 2023.

In Madame Curie , the author, Eve Curie, writes, “Each of us must work for his own improvement, and at the same time share a general responsibility for all humanity, our particular duty being to aid those to whom we think we can be most useful,” The way Steph sees it, Mrs.Clark felt it was her particular duty to help young students. She wishes she could thank Mrs. Clarks and share with her how reading the works on her list has changed her life.“It was never just a list I got from some teacher in school, It's always been Mrs. Clark's Book List, ”says Steph.

### C

Two hours west of a perfectly sunny summer's day in Clackamas, Oregon a foggy breeze awaited me on the Lincoln City coast. After a year of volunteering remotely with Ocean Blue Project, today is a long-awaited beach cleanup.

I didn't expect to take away more than just trash from the beach cleanup. At first glance, the beach appears clean. However, beach cleanups require much more attention than a quick look over. Within just a couple of hours, 71 of us volunteers managed to pick up 171 pounds of debris. Actually, we've got much more than that.

Beach cleanups connect us to nature and provide an escape from the world for a little bit. They also provide a learning opportunity outside of the participation part. When you sit over a pile of—let's face it—garbage, you pick out one by one the pieces

left behind by others. You see first hand the impact we're having on our environment and account for what is left behind the most. Each cigarette butt and plastic bottle sets the tone for how we should be approaching our everyday lives, which is to stop pollution.

Personally, the time spent by the ocean and away from my phone fills me with peace and calmness as I focus my attention only on the moment, looking for the little devils trying to pollute the ocean. With a pound or two less out of the ocean, I always feel a bit more optimistic about the world to come.

This boots-on-the-sand way of making a difference grants me a feeling of accomplishment and purpose. Rather than pondering the dire task of saving the planet or researching and writing ways to do so, I get to physically make a difference. And there's nothing that can replace that instant **gratification** of making positive change for your community and your planet.

After the cleanup, my eyes are now expertly trained to spot loose trash and inorganic materials anywhere I step. Imagine what a huge difference we could all make collectively if we simply stopped and picked up that water bottle or wrapper off the ground instead of passing it by.

These waves of words help us make the journey seem shorter and distance ourselves from the noise. It can make our journey meaningful and help us to start our working days with renewed

energy and enthusiasm.

Reading while traveling brings a unique context to one's reading. Many people take specific books with them to tie into the places they're traveling to. Few things are as enjoyable and satisfying as lifting your eyes to find yourself in the very same country, setting, or context that the book is set in. Of course, it isn't necessary to visit the exact places in a novel in order to experience the sensations that the author is trying to transmit to you. Just the simple fact of being outside the four walls of your house brings new ingredients to reading: sounds, lights, faces, and sensations, among other things.

Reading while traveling improves your ability to concentrate. The truth is that not all people are able to concentrate on a book while they're traveling. Our urban world is noisy. However, it's interesting to note that those who have become used to reading while traveling have developed unique concentration and focusing skills. The ability to read, understand, and visualize other worlds and plots is a skill that can be applied to many other areas in life.

Reading, which is a ticket that transports you to places far beyond your physical destination, is a portable pastime. You don't have to be in bed or on the couch in order to be able to enjoy a book. Reading while traveling is a great way to make the most of your time, thereby turning those moments of inactivity into very active ones for your brain. The only danger that we could point out is that you may get so immersed in your book that you might miss your stop!

As you have probably noticed from watching any public event or business meeting, the "winner" of the talk is usually the person who speaks most energetically and fluently. 40 If you are unconvinced by your own ideas, why should the rest of the room be convinced?

A group of 10 high-profile figures and common citizens gifted with wisdom, bravery and determination, Nobel Prize-winning physicist Yang Zhenning included, 61 (honor) as inspirational role models in this year's Touching China awards announced by China Central Television on Thursday this March.

Yang Zhenning, a 62 (respect) Nobel Prize-winning physicist, became the first Chinese-American scientist to return to China after the US just lifted the ban on 63 (visit) to China in 1971, Yang also sponsored a number of Chinese scholars so they could have opportunities 64 (further) their studies in the US.

Another nominee was Su Bingtian, the first Chinese athlete 65 competed in the men's 100-meter sprint final at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. At 66 age of 32, he shocked the world by finishing first in his group 67 a time of 9.83 seconds on the semi-final.

This year's Touching China awards also focused on China's space community for opening new horizons in the starry ocean of the cosmos, 68 (include) building China's own space station, Tianwen-1, and the exploration of Mars.

In 2021, the war epic film The Battle at Lake Changjin, 69 (take) the Chinese audiences to the site of a battle during the War to Resist the US Aggression and Aid Korea. Moviegoers learned about Zhu Yanfu, the only 70 (survive) of the battle and one of the winners for this year's Touching China awards.
