Darius Brown's passion for animals is matched only by his love of bow ties(蝴蝶领结), and the 12-year-old in Newark, New Jersey decided to combine the two into something useful. Brown's organization, Beaux and Paws, dresses shelter pets up in fancy bow ties made by himself, so the animals can look good while seeking adoption.

Brown was diagnosed(诊断) with comprehension delay, speech delay and fine motor skills delay when he was only two years old, and over time, his family encouraged his creativity as he developed his love for animals and fashion.

His mother, Joy Brown, and sister Dazhai Brown-Shearz noticed a breakthrough for Brown when he turned eight while his sister was admitted to a cosmetology school. There, he began to cut materials and learned to sew to help make his sister hair ribbons(丝带).

"With his fine motor skills delay, he wasn't able to really use his hands well—tying a shoe was challenging," Brown-Shearz said, "My mother and I came up with the idea that if he helped us with things like preparing the ribbon or cutting it and sewing materials together, it would help him. And it did—it worked!"

Shortly after, Brown began making his own bow ties and wore one nearly every day. Strangers would stop Brown to ask him where they were sold. It was then that Beaux and Paws achieved success. Brown has since donated hundreds of bow ties to animal shelters throughout the country and is now in the process of fundraising to provide even more of them for dogs and cats who are looking for a home.

The young businessman has even been acknowledged by a famous leader, who sent him a letter speaking highly of him for his work. "Dear Darius," the letter began. "After hearing your story, I wanted to reach out to commend you for your commitment to community service. From founding Beaux and Paws to lifting up the lives of those around you, it's clear you are doing your part to look out for your fellow citizens."

Andrew Orkin was taking a break from his evening jog to sit by Prospect Park Lake when he was frightened to see a mass of snakes. They turned out to be swamp eels(黄鳝) that had escaped from one of two large plastic bags that split open as a man dragged them to the shoreline. After dumping the eels in the lake, the man walked away, explaining to bystanders that "I just want to save lives."

The illegal release became a curiosity on social media, but the dumping of exotic(外来的) animals in urban parks isn't new. New Yorkers free thousands of non-native animals every year. "People like animals and they sometimes think they're doing a good thing by letting them go," said Jason Munshi-South, an urban ecologist at Fordham University. "Most will die. Some will become a problem, and then there's no going back."

New York state and city officials say it's too soon to know how the eels in Prospect Park might affect local species. The eels eat almost anything including plants, insects, frogs, turtles and other fish. And they could prey(捕食) upon or compete with the park's native species for however long they survive.

There are no plans to eradicate the eels. Since they're active at night and spend most of their time in the mud of lakes and rivers, spotting and removing them from the lake could be impossible. Officials say they will look for swamp eels during the agency's next survey in the spring, but don't expect them to make it through the winter. However, University of Toronto freshwater ecologist Nicholas Mandrak said, "Even if they don't survive, they could have negative short-term effects."

Upright farming is a hugely promising agricultural technique that aims to produce more food to meet the growing population on our limited planet. Techniques include growing in vertical frames(垂向框架) or even in high-rise farms while moving farms into urban areas, and producing nutritious crops without topsoil.

Vertical farmers plant crops in nutrient-rich water, so plants can be raised without soil. They also grow plants using water from fish tanks, or using nutrient water mist systems that reduce water use by more than 90 percent, which was a technique developed by NASA as a way for astronauts to grow in space and feed themselves without soil while preserving precious water supplies. All of these soil-less growing techniques use less or no chemicals, and recycle water with less waste. Plants can be sown and harvested year-round, free from bad weather conditions such as drought or flooding.

"This is the farming of the future," said Paul Myers, co-founder of vertical farming enterprise Farm Urban. "Chemical-free and moving from the traditional horse and tractor agriculture that is steadily destroying the planet to a more sustainable approach."

The global vertical farming market is expected to be six times bigger in 2026 than it is today. This is fueled in part by rising demand for organic, chemical-free foods, but also by countries looking to increase their food security and cut down on imports—the UK for example uses more than 70 percent of its land mass for agriculture but imports more than half of its food.

As the vertical farming industry expands, it is worth noting that it has limitations — it only works for some crops, and urban locations can be expensive.
