##### Chelsea Flower Show, London

Also known as the "Great Spring Show", the Chelsea Flower Show is a wonderful showcase of garden designs and flower displays(展览). Many gardeners come to London from around the world for the five-day event. The fastest way to reach the festival is to get a taxi from London Kings Cross Station, which usually takes around 13 minutes.

##### St Patrick's Day, Ireland

St Patrick's Day celebrates the passing of the patron saint(守护神) and is a national holiday

in Ireland. The capital Dublin takes things to a whole other level, with wonderful street performances, concerts, and displays of artworks. You'll also get the opportunity to take part in some Irish dancing.

### Oktoberfest, Germany

This year will mark the 188th anniversary(周年纪念日) of Munich Oktoberfest. What was previously a few stands is now Germany's largest celebration, which is expected to hold anywhere between 5,000 to 11,000 festival goers.

Though the rides and games are amazing, the beer tents are where the most exciting events are held. All the people are encouraged to dress up and join in the street activities, which include live performances from famous bands.

### Fiesta de San Isidro, Spain

Each year, Spain holds the Fiesta de San Isidro during the spring in memory of the patron saint of Madrid. Over the course of a few days, the whole city becomes a sea of Latin culture, including Spanish music, dance, and theatre both indoors and outdoors. You'll typically see patrons in their San Isidro costumes selling traditional sweet snacks on the streets.

### B

The wind blows across the Northwest plains(平原) as if it is searching for someone or something to carry away. The Omaha tribe(部落) has lived on these plains for generations, and now, it seems that the winds have brought back one of their own. Susan La Flesche has returned to the village where she was born. Not as a visitor, but as the region's only doctor.

When Susan was 8 years old, she waited at the bedside of an old woman crying in pain. A doctor was called for. They waited. A messenger was sent. The doctor still didn't come. Susan provided what comfort she could through the night, but by early next morning, the old woman had died.

The experience both troubled and inspired Susan. She decided to become a doctor. She threw herself into her studies and earned her way to Hampton University in Virginia—a historically black college with a program for native American students.

Susan would never forget the childhood she enjoyed, full of hunts and the people she loved. But there was further to go. She was admitted to the Women's Medical College of Pennsylvania. In her graduation speech, she told the East Coast audience, "Give us a chance." Three years later, she was a doctor.

Instead of staying in big cities, she returned immediately after graduation to her home town to serve the people there, which was a difficult task. She opened an office in a government school and began seeing patients. Susan worked long hours at her office but also braved the wind and snow, walking miles to make house calls. Her work was more than as a doctor. She often acted as lawyer, teacher and counselor(顾问) as she helped the Omahas explore the new world.

The wind that swept the plains was the wind of change. And Dr Susan La Flesche made up her

mind to spend her whole life helping the people in her home town get through the storms.

C

Space travel has arrived! Companies like SpaceX are already taking paying customers into space and Virgin Galactic is booking passengers for its first business flight for the summer of 2023. But space travel is available(可获得的) to a small group of people who are very rich. Now, a Japanese company plans on opening space up to ordinary people.

The company is planning on sending space-viewing balloons that will make space travel available to people who are not wealthy or have no skills needed to fly a rocket(火箭). "It's safe and money-saving for people," Keisuke Iwaya, the CEO of the company, told reporters. "The idea is to make space travel for everyone." he added.

While the balloons do not actually go into outer space, the capsule(太空舱) will fly higher than some planes and will give passengers a clear view of the universe(宇宙).

The company developed a capsule that can fit two people—a pilot and passenger—and a balloon that can fly to a height of 25 kilometers. It took 12 years to develop. Unlike rockets and hot air balloons, the reusable balloons will be lifted by helium(a very light gas). It will take two hours to rise and will stay there for an hour before beginning its going down. The capsule itself is 1.5 meters wide and has several windows that will allow passengers to view the earth below or the universe above.

Keisuke Iwaya worked together with the Japanese travel company JTB Corp to support the sales when the space capsule is ready to operate as a business. Applications are now being accepted until the end of August, 2023. The first five passengers will be announced in October. At this point, the price is out of reach at €167,000 but will be reduced to the tens of thousands of euros.

The first flights will leave once every week, weather permitting. While most future space travelers may dream about flying into space in a rocket, floating in a balloon capsule is a kinder and safer way to travel. Wish you a safe journey!

D

Can cities and nature exist together? The answer is yes.

Visitors to Mexico's second city, Monterrey, will not fail to be impressed by its mountains. But it is now set to be famous for another reason, its large, man-made environmental features.

Monterrey plans to build 18 green corridors(走廊) of trees to fight climate change. Taken together, these projects plan to create over 940,000 square meters of parks, and over 73 km of city streets, taking part in the "extreme tree planting".

The city is set to start its plan for green corridors with the "Park Lake" project in the city's northern area. This will create 80,000 square meters of green public space. In general, this first project aims to offer environmental services such as the water supply to deal with the problem of not having enough water, as well as combatting the extreme heat in the area, and to improve access to green spaces and recreational(娱乐的) areas for locals. The project is not about government actions; it is about creating community together with the people. It is realizing a good connection between companies, between people and government.

What is planned for the first stage of the project? Locals can expect increased recreational features like exercise areas and spaces for picnics, outdoor games, and quality play areas for children.

*Designing Buildings* reports that green corridors also connect the animals that have been separated by human development such as roads and houses, leading to an increase in the population of animals and preventing animals and plants from becoming too weak.

These green corridors are used for many different purposes, offering an impressive list of social and environmental benefits to humans, and wild animals and plants. These include greater city and environmental qualities such as recreational areas, community gardening, and the cooling space under the trees. They encourage sports activities, social communication, happiness in nature, and non-polluting vehicles such as bicycles. They also help to prevent heat islands from forming, and protect people from air pollution.
