B

Pelé was born on October 23, 1940, in Três Corações, Brazil, the first child of João Ramos and Dona Celeste. He moved with his family to the city of Bauru as a young boy.

João Ramos struggled to earn a living as a soccer player, and Pelé grew up in poverty(贫穷). Still, he developed a basic talent for soccer by kicking a rolled-up sock stuffed with rags around the streets of Bauru. The origin of the name "Pelé" is unclear, though he recalled despising(鄙视) it when his friends first referred to him that way.

As an adolescent, Pelé joined a youth team coached by Waldemar de Brito, a former member of the Brazilian national soccer team. De Brito convinced Pelé's family to let the young man leave home and try out for the Santos professional soccer club when he was 15.

Pelé signed with Santos and immediately started practising with the team's regulars. He scored the first professional goal of his career before he turned 16, leading the league in goals in his first full season. Then he was recruited(入选) to play for the Brazilian national team.

The world was officially introduced to Pelé in the 1958 World Cup in Sweden. Displaying remarkable speed, athleticism and field vision, the young man erupted to score three goals in a 5-2 semifinal win over France, and then netted two more in the finals, a 5-2 win over the host country.

The young superstar received many offers to play for European clubs. Brazilian President Jânio Quadros eventually had Pelé declared a national treasure, making it legally difficult for him to play in another country. Regardless, Santos club ownership ensured its star attraction was well paid by scheduling profitable exhibition matches with teams around the world.

A recent study found that increased screen time during infancy(幼儿期) was associated with poorer executive(执行) functioning skills when the child was 9 years old. The result supports recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics(AAP), which discourages all screen time before 18 months old, with the exception of video chatting.

Executive functioning skills are mental processes that enable us to plan, focus attention, remember instructions, and deal with multiple tasks successfully. Those executive functioning skills are also important for higher-level cognition(认知), such as learning, academic achievement and mental health. "Those skills influence our success socially, academically, professionally and in how we care for ourselves. Though these cognitive processes naturally develop from infancy through adulthood, they are also impacted by the experiences that we have and when we have them in our development," said Dr. Erika Chiappini, lead scientist of the study.

Researchers looked at data from Growing Up in Singapore Towards Healthy Outcomes, which surveyed children from all socioeconomic backgrounds. The sample was made up of 437 children who underwent EEG scans, which were used to look at the neural pathways of cognitive functions in the brain at age 1, 18 months and 9 years old. They then asked the parents about each child's screen time, and the researchers found there was an association between screen time in infancy and executive functioning skills at 9 years old.

In a learning packed time like infancy, one of the big problems with screen use is that young children aren't learning much from them. "There is no replacement for adult interaction, modeling and teaching," said Chiappini.

Babies have a hard time interpreting information presented on screens, and have trouble distinguishing fantasy from reality. "Babies and kids are also social learners and benefit a lot from the back-and-forth interaction with others, which is hard to achieve with screens," Chiappini added.

This morning before work, I decided to walk to have coffee and a light breakfast. I usually make this under-half-a-mile trip once or twice a week, but I'm almost always in my car. That's fairly common by US mobility standards. In 2021, over half of daily vehicle trips in the US were less than three miles, according to the research of the Bureau of Transportation Statistics.

We know driving less would help reduce vehicle emissions(排放) and their effects on air pollution and the climate crisis. That's easier said than done in a state where we're driving more in recent years. Now, there's one alternative more Americans have been turning to: electric bikes.

E-bike sales have soared in the past few years. For many, they provide an eco-friendly alternative to driving with comparable travel time and fewer problems, like finding a parking spot. And the cost to purchase and maintain an e-bike is much lower than what it costs to own a car. A basic e-bike typically sells for somewhere between \$1,000 and \$2,000.

In response to the growing interest in e-bikes, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) is preparing to launch an e-bike incentives (优惠) program. "The added benefit with this project is reducing VMT (vehicle miles traveled)," said Lisa Macumber, who leads CARB's equitable mobility incentives branch. "That's really going towards the air quality, finding ways to help individuals to get to and from the grocery store and take cars off the road."

CARB's current proposal is to offer a point-of-sale incentive (different from a discount) of \$1,000 off a standard e-bike, with an additional \$750 discount for larger cargo bikes, and adaptive bikes. The state has allocated the program \$13 million in one-time spending.

CARB has hosted seven working groups so far to explain the plan to Californians and hear their thoughts. "The level of public participation has been a standout I've never seen," said Aria Berliner, an air pollution specialist for the agency. "That's really awesome how engaged people are."
