21. D 细节理解题。根据 **North Rim Campground, Grand Canyon, Arizona** 部分的“Camping in the famous Grand Canyon, with its layers of million-year-old red rock, is the favorite item for many people.”可知,宿营者在 North Rim Campground 可以欣赏到有数百万年历史的红色岩石。

22. C 细节理解题。根据 **Watchman Campground, Zion National Park, Utah** 部分的“allowing campers access to bike trails along the riverbank plus hiking to a nearby archeological (考古学的) site”可知,如果宿营者是一个历史学家,他可能更愿意去 Watchman Campground。

23. D 细节理解题。根据 **Hidden Valley Campground, Joshua Tree National Park, California** 部分的“for campers wanting to enjoy a unique experience in the desert, sleeping under the starry skies...”可知,宿营者在 Hidden Valley Campground 可以欣赏到繁星之夜。

24. B 词义猜测题。根据第二段的“I lost hair from all over my head, especially on the top where I had a huge bald spot.”以及“I called Tonya and told her what happened to my hair with tears.”可知,作者开始脱发,尤其是头顶

- 位置最严重,为此,她向朋友哭诉,由此可知,作者的心情是担惊受怕的。
25. C 推理判断题。根据第四段中丈夫的话“Baby, just wear your hair, I like your natural hair.”以及第五段中母亲的话“Cassie I love your natural look. I get to see how beautiful you are.”可知,作者的丈夫和母亲都不赞成她戴假发,在他们的眼里,作者真实的模样是最美的,由此可推知,作者在听取了亲人的想法后,决定放弃假发。
26. A 细节理解题。根据倒数第二段的内容可知,作者的堂兄开了一家理发店,作者去他那里是为了剪头发。
27. D 推理判断题。通读全文可知,文章主要介绍了作者从戴假发到摘假发的心路历程,告诉读者一个道理:自然的才是最值得的。
28. C 推理判断题。根据第二段的“*There is as much good as there is evil. Optimism is a learnable skill.*”可知,这个世界有好的一面,也有坏的一面,乐观的心态是可以后天培养的,重要的是你如何看待这个世界。
29. B 推理判断题。根据第三段的内容可知,作者的一位朋友以不要让邻居把垃圾放在自家的院子为例,告诉作者不要把消极的情绪放进自己的头脑里,由此可推知,消极的人和事会对我们的思想产生恶劣的影响。
30. D 细节理解题。根据最后一段的“*Schedule some ‘me’ time, but also structure your day to get your high-value, high-priority things done and the less important yet ‘urgent’ tasks done afterwards.*”可知,作者建议我们要精心安排自己的时间,分清事情的轻重缓急。
31. A 标题归纳题。通读全文可知,文章主要讲述了如何养成积极的心态,即养成积极心态的方法。故选项 A 适合作文章标题。
32. A 细节理解题。根据第二段的“*This was not found in some exotic tropical location, but really right on our doorstep in Vancouver. You could exactly walk out from Vancouver to this field site.*”可知,Graham 强调的是这次发现发生在本地。
33. B 代词指代题。根据第四段的“*Additionally, the digestive enzyme(消化酶) released by the sticky hairs in flower stems was similar to that found in other carnivorous plants.*”可知,花茎粘毛上释放的消化酶与其他食肉植物中的消化酶相似。这里的 *that* 指的是前面提到的消化酶。
34. C 细节理解题。根据第五段的“*The scientists say this is the first time they have encountered the deadly trap on the flower’s stem, and the sticky hairs on the stem of Triantha Occidentalis can only catch small insects, not the larger bees or butterflies involved in pollination.*”可知,西部假水仙靠花茎上的粘毛捕捉昆虫。
35. D 标题归纳题。本文主要介绍了研究人员偶然发现西部野水仙其实是一种食肉植物,故 D 项适合作文章标题。

41. B 考查动词。它摧毁了 8 000 栋建筑,伤及 1 100 多人,夺走了 161 条生命。
42. A 考查形容词。几秒钟之内,他们熟悉多年的家就变得不适宜居住了。

43. C 考查动词。“我”的父母被安全安置之后,“我”就试图抢救他们剩下的财产。
44. B 考查副词。遗憾的是,“我”发现他们的大部分家具和衣服都被毁了。
45. D 考查动词。“我”的父母期望“我”能抢救一些他们的书籍和照片。
46. A 考查动词。不幸的是,每当“我”试图从抽屉里拿走一本相册或从书架上拿走一本书时,大雨都会淋湿“我”想保护的东西。
47. D 考查动词短语。突然,一个又矮又瘦的老人出现在“我”的身边。
48. A 考查形容词。他用安慰的语气对“我”说:“一切都会好起来的。”

51. C 考查名词。“我”用毛巾擦干了几本相册和几本书,然后把这些珍贵的东西放进塑料袋里防雨。
52. D 考查动词。“我”抬起了头,看到他成功地在整个房子上面铺上了防水的帆布。
53. B 考查名词。“我”跑出去感谢他,但是已没有他的踪迹。
54. C 考查形容词。“我”想告诉他,“我”非常感激他的帮助。
55. C 考查名词。他给了“我”帮助、安慰和希望。
56. importance 考查词性转换。attach importance to “重视;认为重要”。
57. that/which 考查定语从句。分析句子结构可知,空处所在句为限制性定语从句,从句中缺少主语,且先行词为 skills,指物,故填关系代词 that/which。
58. our 考查代词。此处应用形容词性物主代词,修饰后面的名词 degrees, certificates 等,故填 our。
59. to measure 考查非谓语动词。此处为固定句型“主语 + be + 形容词 + to do”,意为“软技能比硬技能更难衡量”,故填动词不定式 to measure。
60. but 考查连词。根据句意可知,此处为“not... but...”结构,意为“不是……而是……”,故填 but。
61. are called 考查动词时态和语态。文章通篇在介绍一般性事实,应用一般现在时,且主语 They 和动词 call 之间是被动关系,应用被动语态,故填 are called。
62. typically 考查词性转换。此处应用副词作状语修饰动词 relate,故填 typically。
63. mentioned 考查非谓语动词。此处应用过去分词作定语修饰 soft skills,故填 mentioned。
64. a 考查冠词。此处应用不定冠词表泛指,意为“一个全面发展的人”,故填 a。
65. competitive 考查词性转换。此处应用形容词作定语修饰名词 edge,表示“竞争优势”,故填 competitive。
