Winter hikes bring their own challenges and rewards for the adventurous walker. From Roman ruins to the Welsh 3000s, we explore the best winter hikes in the UK.

Great Gable, Lake District

This is one of the most popular and well—loved Lakeland fells with 360—degree panoramic(全景的) views. This mountain stands tall at 899m, and there are many different routes up to the summit, depending on how much of a challenge you want.

This is an amazing hike in wintery conditions, but never underestimate how quickly the weather can change. Make sure you have plenty of layers, and a flask of your favourite warm drink to enjoy at the summit while you take in the views.

Estimated walk time: 4 hours

Length: 6.1km

Difficulty: Challenging

Y Garn via East Ridge, Snowdonia

Y Garn is one of the 15 mountains that are over 3000ft tall in Wales.

Part of the Welsh 3000s, this is a fab hike for beginners or solo hikers with a straightforward path. The route is flat for the first half a mile up to Llyn Idwal tarn, and once you reach the summit, you have incredible views over Ogwen Valley.

The views are incredible looking over to Tryfan and the Ogwen Valley, making it well worth the climb.

Estimated walk time: 3 hours 50 minutes

Length: 7.6km

Difficulty: Moderate to challenging

Mam Tor via Great Ridge, Peak District

Mam Tor (Mother Hill) stands at 517m, situated in the Peak District within the village of Castleton. This popular walk is great for solo hikers with an obvious path, and the route is usually busy, so there are always people about.

It boasts amazing views of Winnats Pass—a famous Limestone Gorge with an entrance to Speedwell Cavern.

Estimated walk time: 4 hours

Length: 12.9km

Difficulty: Moderate

Pen Y Ghent, Yorkshire Dales

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the Dales. This popular hike is another great one for solo hikers with a well-led path.

There is a great windbreak at the top to sit and take in the views.

There is an option to take the easier path with a gradual incline to the summit or the red route, which is more challenging.

This paragraph is not ordinary. Look at it. At first, it won't look too odd. Just a normal paragraph, you may think. But look at it again and you might find it a bit unusual. Just a tiny bit. What's wrong with it, you may ask. Nothing wrong at all, in fact. Look again. Is anything not right? Can you spot it? Is anything missing?

What you've just read is a lipogram—a text written without using a particular letter of the alphabet. It's the hardest kind of lipogram, as it doesn't contain the letter E—the most common letter in English language. Now imagine the task faced by the French writer Georges Perec, when a friend challenged him to write a whole novel without using E—a letter that is even more common in French than in English.

Perec was frighteningly clever. He wrote crossword puzzles for Paris magazines. He had already written a 5,000 word palindrome—a text that reads the same forwards and backwards, like the well—known 'A man, a plan, a canal—Panama'. But his friends thought that this task would be beyond him.

He took up the challenge. He was unable to use more than 70 percent of the words in the French language. Surely enough to kill any writer's ability to create. But on the contrary, he discovered that this impossible rule unlocked his imagination. He later claimed that he wrote his novel faster than any of his other books. The result was La Disparition, a surreal detective story about the mysterious disappearance of a character named A Vowl. (Get it?) The only Es were the four in his name on the cover.

C

High in the Swiss Alps, St Moritz made its name as a place for pushing the boundaries of winter sports. Recently, the region continued its long tradition of expanding the limits of what is possible with a world record attempt—not on snow or ice, but on rails. To mark the 175th anniversary of Switzerland's first railway, a railway company created the world's longest passenger train—100 cars, 2,990 tonnes and almost two kilometers long.

Formed of 25 new electric trains, the record—breaking 1,906—meter train took almost an hour to cover around 25 kilometers over the impressive UNESCO World Heritage Albula Line, which is famous for its endless swooping curves and steep inclines(斜坡). The mountain railways are regarded as great feats of engineering. The 62—kilometer line between Thusis and St Moritz, a world—renowned masterpiece of civil engineering, took just five years to build despite requiring 55 bridges and 39 tunnels.

Unlike most Swiss and European railways, which use the standard gauge(标准轨距) between the rails of 1.435 meters, the rails, known as Rhaetische Bahn rails, are just one meter apart. "In order to complete the train's journey successfully, everything has to be perfect. We need to be 100% synchronized(同步的), every second. Everyone has to keep their speed and other systems under control at all times," lead driver Andreas Kramer said. "We need to know the Albula Line very well, every change of gradient, and every incline."

The mountainous Swiss landscape has encouraged creative transportation solutions for generations, resulting in one of the most train—reliant nations in the world. On average, Swiss citizens travel about 2,450 kilometers by train annually—an estimated quarter of their total transportation system. In 2021, Swiss Federal Railways operated 11,260 trains carrying 880,000 passengers and 185,000 tonnes of goods per day on a 3,265 kilometer—long network with 804 stations. Therefore, the successful record attempt will be

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great for the local area and for the country as a whole.

Nuclear bombs. That's the go-to answer for incoming space objects like asteroids (小行星) and comets as far as Hollywood is concerned. Movies like *Deep Impact and Armageddon* rely on nuclear weapons, delivered by stars like Bruce Willis, to save the world and deliver the drama.

But planetary defense experts say in reality, if astronomers spotted a dangerous incoming space rock, the safest and best answer might be something more subtle, like simply pushing it off course by crashing it with a small spacecraft.

That's just what NASA did on Monday evening, when a spacecraft headed straight into an asteroid called Dimorphos, which is around 7 million miles away and poses no threat to Earth. It's about 525 feet across and orbits another larger asteroid.

In images streamed(传输)as the crash neared, the egg—shaped asteroid grew in size from a little spot on screen to have its full rocky surface come quickly into focus before the signal went dead as the craft hit right on target.

Events happened exactly as engineers had planned, they said, with nothing going wrong. "As far as we can tell, our first planetary defense test was a success," said Elena Adams, the mission systems engineer, who added that scientists looked on with "both terror and joy" as the spacecraft neared its final destination.

The crash was the peak of NASA's Double Asteroid Redirection Test (DART), a 7—year and more than \$300 million effort which launched a space vehicle in November of 2021 to perform humanity's first ever test of planetary defense technology. It will be about two months, scientists said, before they will be able to determine if the crash was enough to drive the asteroid slightly off course, probably shortening its original orbit.

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NASA plans to launch an asteroid—hunting space telescope named NEO Surveyor in 2026. "We've tracked lots of space rocks, especially the larger ones that could cause extinction—level events. Thankfully, none currently threaten Earth. But many asteroids the size of Dimorphos haven't yet been discovered, and those could potentially take out a city if they came crashing down." explains Lindley Johnson. NASA's Planetary Defense Officer.

Since 2011, people around the world have been celebrating World Introvert Day on January 2. The word introverted describes a personality type. 36 They are likely to feel exhausted by environments that are highly simulating and may often need to go to a quiet place to recharge.

World Introvert Day began with a blog post from German psychologist Felicitas Heyne. She suggested that introverts are often misunderstood and their mental health suffers because popular culture is dominated by extroverts. Her idea was to celebrate World Introvert Day to raise awareness of the social challenges that introverts face. 37

There are many famous introverts in art and science, such as Albert Einstein, Charles Darwin, and J.K. Rowling. It is believed that many introverts have a great ability to focus and strong power of imagination.

<u>38</u> Extroverts love connecting with other people, work well in groups, and are usually very confident. When introverts don't fit into groups of extroverts they may be seen

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as cold, uninterested, or shy. Popular culture tells us that it is important to network, so-cialize, and communicate, but all of this can make introverts feel uncomfortable.

Scientists are studying what causes someone to be an introvert or an extrovert. Recent studies show that genes are a factor, and most people seem to be born with one personality or the other. 39 The brain of an introvert can respond dramatically to a very mild stimulus, but the brain of an extrovert tends to need a stronger stimulus to have the same reaction.

Our environment and experiences also influence whether we are introverted or extroverted. The term ambivert describes someone who is right in the middle. 40

Being caught in a flood is incredible dangerous. Like many other natural disaster, floods can occur with little and no warning. 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


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
