Jack Wietbrock loves turtles. Now his love for the reptiles has led to the first Turtle Crossing sign in West Lafayette Indiana.

The city has many ponds and lakes, and Cherry Lane Road is surrounded by small ponds. Turtles regularly cross the busy road as they go from pond to pond. Not every turtle makes it across safely. Seeing turtles that had been hit by cars really made Jack depressed according to his mum Michelle Wietbrock.

That night, the second grader wrote a letter to West Lafayette Mayor John Dennis that said, "Dear Mayor Dennis, there are turtles crossing the road and they need our help! Can you please put up a turtle crossing sign? Thank you."

A few weeks later, Jack received a reply to his letter. Mayor Dennis said that he was moved by the boy's sympathy for the turtles and since the city's park department has a machine that can make custom signs, Dennis commissioned (委托) the first "Turtle X-ing" sign for the city. The mayor also wrote that the sign was going to be presented at the next city Board of Works meeting and invited Jack and his brother to attend.

Dennis said at the presentation, "The great thing about West Lafayette is that we embrace the unique and, in some cases, the odd. So, we talk, 'You know what, there's something we can do here that's going to be kind of cool and celebrates Jack's initiative on making us aware of a problem.'"

Jack, who was asked to say a few words at the presentation said, "I just want to say I care about the whole Earth and everyone on it. That's all."

One little boy's sympathy and love for animals—and turtles—led to a city's action. This should inspire us to speak up about conservation in a big way. If we all lend our voices, we can save our endangered species, even the small pond turtles.

During a holiday dinner party, the host suggested we each share a significant moment from the year. As one woman shared how her pottery class had allowed her to explore her creative side, another cheekily said, "Oh, you could totally open up an Etsy shop and sell your work." Before she even finished the sentence, I said loudly, "No! Don't monetize(使货币化) your hobby!"

It's advice that perhaps seems heretical in this time of high inflation. After all, it took \$107 in November 2022 to buy what \$100 bought in November 2021, according to the US Department of Labour. Between 2019 and 2020, the increase was only \$1.17. But despite rising prices, it's important to keep the side hustle(副业) mindset in check.

A hobby, by definition, is supposed to be something you pursue outside of your job for relaxation. Of course, you can have hobbies that are mentally or physically challenging such as chess or hiking. However, a hobby is no longer a hobby once you add a price tag and start to sell your wares to consumers. That's a job.

There is certainly a dark side in pushing people to continually consider profitability. As a recovering member of the constantly side-hustling community, I can say confidently that respecting the sanctity(神圣) of at least one or two hobbies for fulfillment does wonders for one's mental health.

For those whose interests result in physical creations—like woodworking, painting, producing pottery or making jewelry—it can result in clutter(杂乱). Beautiful clutter, but lots of it, that perhaps you don't need in your home. In this case, yes, it can indeed make sense to sell your wares and perhaps use that money to reinvest in your hobby. But selling off a surplus(过剩) is much different from building a side hustle.

Some hobbies should simply be hobbies. We are allowed to create and learn for personal enrichment, even if it costs us some money—and earns none.

In 2019, the average person produced 7.3 kg of electronic waste including used and deserted electronic devices. This adds up to 53.6 mn tonnes worldwide, an alarming quantity that will only continue to grow as global consumption increases.

The environmental cost is clear: e-waste is not handled properly, polluting the environment with clear ecological and human costs, and contributes a large share of the global greenhouse gas emissions which drive climate change. The problem will not be solved without a global effort.

Much of the world's electronic waste will not be recycled, reused or even disposed of in a safe and controlled manner. Only around 17.4 percent was officially recorded as recycled in 2019—very low relative to other types of waste such as plastics and paper. This has serious consequences for people and the environment. For progress to be made, there has to be serious investment in improving our recycling facilities.

But a bad recycling system is not the only failure. An estimated 60 to 90 percent of e-waste was illegally traded or simply got rid of outside official waste disposal systems as recently as 2015. This imposes a substantial ecological footprint, because the waste pollutes ecosystems with microplastics and poisonous chemicals.

The root cause lies in consumer habits. Across the developed world, people consume electronics at an avoidably high rate. The average American smartphone lasts only 24.7 months before being thrown out, and 26.2 months in the EU. The pattern is not limited to smartphones. However, consumers are not the only ones at fault for the problem of device lifetimes. Tech companies including Apple and Microsoft have been accused of “planned obsolescence(报废)”, or deliberately slowing down their older devices to encourage people to buy new ones. There are also barriers to the repair of broken devices.

Instead of engineering shortened lifespans and releasing new products so rapidly, tech groups must improve the quality and longevity(长寿) of their devices without ruining their commercial success. Governments can help by subsidizing(补贴) producers with longer device lifespans, and by improving access to spare parts with expanded laws like the right-to-repair.
