I met Steven on my way to Dublin Airport at the end of a business trip. A cheerful, talkative fellow with a friendly smile. As a local taxi driver, he has probably visited every street of the city. But his childhood years spent in Swansea makes him feel Welsh.

"I often wonder where home is for me, I'd like to think it's Swansea but I have a life here now," he explained to me. Having left Swansea as a teenager, he has since lost contact with all his childhood friends, and most of his family left there too.

His words surprised me, as I had considered cultural similarities and ease of movement across Europe made the concept of home unrelated. I had thought high tech communications in our globalized world would have shortened the 250 miles distance between Dublin and Swansea to almost none.

It's just not what I pictured. But I should not have been surprised. Despite growing global connectivity, identity is still central to people's hearts. Looking back at my own life, I feel perhaps I understand Steven's situation. I was born and grew up in Chongqing, in Southwest China. After living for eight years in London, I have made many local British friends and learnt to appreciate British humor. With a reputation as one of the world's most multicultural cities, London always makes its residents feel welcome regardless of their origin. But I also felt a little "something missing" in Steven's words.

As China increasingly opens up to the world, more and more Chinese will travel abroad to work, study and live, but China will remain forever a home for them. And sitting in Steven's taxi, witnessing his love for Swansea, I realized the desire for such a place you belong to is universally shared.

In our daily life, anxiety, curiosity and jealousy are often applied to describe emotions in different situations. But what do these have in common? The common theme is this: they are a state of feeling that results in physical and psychological changes that influence our behavior. Besides adding variety or "color" to our lives, emotions help us respond to important situations and communicate our thoughts to others. In the meanwhile, emotion is also linked to behavior. Some people are more likely to be social and express their emotions, while others are more likely to hide their emotions in public.

What happens when we experience emotions? In brief, emotional responses have four parts: a physical response, an interpretation (演绎) in the mind, feelings, and an effect on behavior. These do not happen in any special order—they happen at the same time and affect each other. Now we will show this process with the most carefully studied of all emotions: fear.

To understand the physical response, imagine you are frightened by an aggressive noisy dog. Your brain sends messages throughout your body by releasing a chemical called adrenaline (肾上腺素), which the body carries to other parts of the body. Then, the bodily reactions begin. Blood flows from your stomach. The blood flow in the face decreases, which makes you become whiter.

The second aspect is interpretation in the mind of events and feelings. This is both conscious and unconscious. In fact, the more you think about the dog, the more frightened you become. Thinking like this sends both your feelings and your physical response to new heights.

The "feeling" aspect of emotion comes from two sources. In one, the brain senses the body's reaction. The other comes from memories of your body's reactions in similar situations in the past.

Finally, emotions can also affect behavior. In response to the aggressive dog, this could be the so-called "fight-or-flight" response which appears to be part of our biology. In this, the person either becomes more aggressive or runs away.

Everything one enjoys in life has a price. There is no free lunch in the world, for, generally, someone pays. This reality informs why we need to be careful when surfing on the Internet. Every action has its consequence; nothing is free. Therefore, one pays for everything else, somehow, somewhere and sometime; and the Internet is no exception. It never forgives. It never forgets.

Besides the fact that someone sees and can locate whoever is using any device that has a tiny front camera (cell phone, tablet, laptop or desktop), you leave digital footprints each time you visit the Internet. Is it not surprising that often search engines and online marketing platforms suggest to you things similar to what you have already searched for or bought? This fact is possible because you leave digital footprints. These footprints can not be removed on the Internet so long as the Internet exists. Deleting is a pure trick because it gives you the impression that the stuff is gone. But it remains. It is gone from one level of Internet operations but remains at other deeper layers. All our digital footprints and records are all stored in the cyber cloud. A simple analysis of your activities on the Internet for the past ten years will shock you as to the extent the Internet remembers.

Yet responsible use of the Internet can be a <u>boon</u> for a young person. Prevention in time saves one from falling victim to the destructive consequences of the misuse of the Internet. Rightly said, unexamined use of the Internet and irresponsible involvement with the social media leads to psycho-social and emotional disorders that upset progress and ruin a person. While engaging in the Internet, be mindful that your activities today can work against you in the near, distant or eternal future when you might have grown or changed.

The Internet never forgets, so be careful of your activities on social media. While engaging in social media, think about the future so as not to allow the Internet to ruin your dream. Indeed, some suffer awful consequences because of their childishness, carelessness or ignorance. Keep in mind always: the Internet neither forgives nor forgets.

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


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
