写作第一节评分标准

一、评分原则:

1. 本题总分为 15 分,按五个档次进行评分。
2. 评分时,应主要从内容组织、词汇语法和篇章结构三个方面考虑,具体为:
 - (1) 对内容要点的覆盖情况以及表述的清楚程度和合理性。
 - (2) 使用词汇和语法结构的准确性、恰当性和多样性。
 - (3) 上下文的衔接和全文的连贯性。

3. 评分时,先根据作答的整体情况初步确定其所属档次,然后以该档次的要求来综合衡量,确定或调整档次,最后给分。

4. 评分时还应注意:

- (1) 词数少于 60,从总分中减去 2 分;
- (2) 单词拼写和标点符号是写作规范的重要方面,评分时应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑。英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受;
- (3) 书写较差以致影响交际的,将分数降低一个档次。

第五档:(13-15 分)

一能写明基本要点;语言虽有较多错误,但能基本达意;

第二档:(4-6 分)

一能写出部分要点,语言错误多,影响意思表达;

第一档:(1-3 分)

一只能写出一两个要点;语言错误很多,只有个别句子正确。

3. 评分时,应先根据作答的整体情况确定其所属的档次,然后以该档次的要求来综合衡量,确定或调整档次,最后给分。

4. 评分时还应注意:

(1)词数少于120的,酌情扣分。

(2)书写较差以致影响交际的,酌情扣分。

(3)单词拼写和标点符号是写作规范的重要方面,评分时应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑,英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。

第四档 (16-20)	1. 创造了比较丰富合理的内容,比较有逻辑性,续写比较完整,与原文情境融洽度较高。 2. 比较有效使用了多样且恰当的词汇和语法结构,表达比较流畅,有个别错误,但完全不影响理解。 3. 比较有效的使用了语句间的衔接手段,全文比较结构清晰,意义比较连贯。
第三档 (11-15)	1. 创造了基本丰富合理的内容,基本具有逻辑性,续写基本完整,与原文情境相关。 2. 基本有效使用了多样且恰当的词汇和语法结构,表达基本流畅,语言有些许错误,但基本不影响理解。 3. 基本有效的使用了语句间的衔接手段,全文结构基本清晰,意义基本连贯。
第二档 (6-10)	1. 内容和逻辑上有一些重大的问题,续写不够完整,与原文有一定程度上脱节。 2. 所使用的词汇有限,语法结构单调,错误较多且比较低级,影响理解。 3. 未能有效的使用词句间的衔接手段,全文结构不够清晰,意义欠连贯。
第一档 (1-5)	1. 内容和逻辑上有较多重大的问题,或有部分内容抄自原文,续写不完整,与原文情节基本脱节。 2. 所使用的词汇非常有限,语法结构单调,错误极多且严重影响理解。 3. 几乎没有使用词句间的衔接手段,全文结构不清晰,意义不连贯。

W: French writer Annie Ernaux used her own experience to explore life in France since the 1940s. In 2022, the Swedish Academy announced that she had won the year's Nobel Prize in Literature. She is the first French female writer to win the Nobel Prize in Literature following Patrick Modiano in 2014. Ernaux started out by writing creative stories, or fiction, based on her own life, but quickly moved from fiction to factual stories about her life. Anders Olsson is the chair of the Nobel Committee in Literature. He said Ernaux had said she was producing a scientific study of herself rather than writing fiction. He told reporters that she had created something people could respect and that it would last a long time. Ernaux wrote more than 20 books. Most of them are very short. They record events in her life and the lives of those around her. She tries to tell the facts of the events she is experiencing.
