Tall, long-necked giraffes are famous for their spots. The spots are believed to help the animals hide from their enemies. The skin beneath the spots may also help giraffes stay at the right temperature. Just like no two humans have the same fingerprints, each giraffe has its own special pattern of spots.

Unless, of course, it doesn't have any spots. Recently a baby giraffe was born at Brights Zoo in Limestone, Tennessee with no spots at all. Instead, its fur is a light brown. The giraffe is a reticulated(网纹) giraffe, which is one of the four different kinds of giraffes. It was born perfectly healthy. It just doesn't have any spots.

David Bright, who runs the zoo, said, "This is beyond rare. The last time this happened was 1972 in Japan." Currently, the young giraffe is believed to be the only spotless giraffe in the world. The young giraffe is a girl. Giraffes are born quite large. This one isn't quite a month old, and she's already about 1.8 meters tall. Mr. Bright says she's very sweet, and has a relaxed personality. A giraffe's pattern of spots is created when the animal is still growing inside its mother. That means that this giraffe will never have spots.

Mr. Bright says that the new giraffe might not have survived if she had been born in the wild. "Being solid colored, she may not be able to hide quite as well," said Mr. Bright. He also thought it was likely that the giraffe would be a "key target for poachers" because she's so unusual.

Reticulated giraffes are already struggling. In 2018, they were officially listed as "threatened". Thirty-five years ago, there were 36,000 reticulated giraffes. Now, those numbers have been cut by more than 50%. Only about 16,000 reticulated giraffes remain. Brights Zoo is hoping to use the young spotless giraffe to bring attention to efforts to protect giraffes. Mr. Bright says the zoo hopes to raise money for groups like Save Giraffes Now and the Giraffe Conservation Foundation.

Cruise and Waymo are two companies that have been developing self-driving taxis, sometimes called "robotaxis" (robot + taxi). Until recently, the cars have had a human in the driver's seat, ready to take over if there was a problem. But the newest self-driving cars don't have anyone in the driver's seat. They are programmed to do everything on their own, including obeying the rules of the road, following speed limits, and avoiding people and other cars.

In early August, Waymo and Cruise were given full permission to operate their robotaxis. The companies were allowed to run as many driverless cars as they wanted, 24 hours a day. And the companies weren't required to have safety drivers in their cars. The move was a big step for self-driving cars, and many people were excited about the change. The new rules also allowed the companies to charge for every ride, which meant that the robotaxis could finally start to earn money.

But almost immediately, there were problems. A Cruise car crashed into a fire truck, sending a person to the hospital. Later, a Cruise car stopped working in the middle of a crossroad, causing a traffic jam. As a result, Cruise was told to take half of its robotaxis off the roads.

In one recent example, a self-driving car got stuck in wet concrete because it didn't know that wet concrete was different from a road. In another case, a robotaxi killed a dog. The self-driving system knew the dog was there, but didn't know how to avoid it. One group that is upset about self-driving cars has found an unusual way to protest: putting traffic cones(圆锥体)on the robotaxis. The con e confuses the car's driving system and leaves them unable to move.

In spite of the problems, both Waymo and Cruise are planning to expand their self-driving car service to other cities. Cruise has plans to bring their robotaxis to at least 15 cities. Waymo says its driverless system will soon be able to work "in any city, on any kind of vehicle". Though the quality of self-driving cars is improving, it's likely to be a while before most people view them as safe.

I.—Listen

E-Encourage action

Help your friend think of a trusted adult they can talk to. Sometimes a listening ear might be all our friends need. Other times their feelings or problems are just too big for friends to manage on their own. The next step of an "RU OK?" conversation is to encourage action. 39

C-Check in




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
